SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Extends state preemption of local governmental authority to regulate work schedule requirements. Provides exceptions.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN AC'

- Relating to preemption of local governmental authority to regulate work schedule requirements; amending section 1, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2015; repealing section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2015; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 1, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2015, is amended to read:
- 7 **Sec. 1.** (1) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Enact" includes but is not limited to adopt, amend, refer, make effective, make operative, [or] pass or effectuate a previously passed law [with a delayed operative or effective date].
 - (b) "Local government" includes a county, city, district or other public corporation, authority or entity organized and existing under statute or city or county charter.
 - (c) "Work schedule" means the days and times during which an employee is required by an employer to perform the duties for which the employee will receive compensation.
 - (2) The State of Oregon preempts all charter and statutory authority of local governments to enact a requirement relating to work schedules [before the date of adjournment sine die of the 2017 regular session of the Legislative Assembly].
 - (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, a local government may set work schedule requirements:
 - (a) For public employers; and
 - (b) In specifications for public contracts or subcontracts entered into by the local government.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 2, chapter 591, Oregon Laws 2015, is repealed.
 - SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
