# Senate Bill 374

Sponsored by Senator HANSELL; Representative BARRETO (Presession filed.)

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Authorizes Department of Transportation to issue driver licenses, driver permits and identification cards that meet requirements of federal Real ID Act of 2005. Real ID compliant documents shall be known as Star IDs.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Real ID Act of 2005; creating new provisions; amending ORS 802.179, 807.022,

3 807.024, 807.040, 807.050, 807.110, 807.115, 807.400 and 807.730; repealing ORS 801.060, 801.063

4 and 801.066; and declaring an emergency.

5 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

6 <u>SECTION 1.</u> ORS 801.060, 801.063 and 801.066 are repealed.

7 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Sections 3 to 10 of this 2017 Act are added to and made a part of the Oregon
8 Vehicle Code.

9 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Star ID definition. "Star ID" means a driver license, driver permit or iden-

10 tification card that is compliant with the Real ID Act of 2005, P.L. 109-13, and marked with 11 a distinguishing feature.

12 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Star ID issuance, replacement and renewal; requirements. (1) The Depart-13 ment of Transportation shall issue a Star ID to any person who:

(a) Meets the requirements for a driver license, driver permit or identification card as
 described in the vehicle code;

(b) Submits documentation, as required by rule by the department, establishing the
 person's:

18 (A) Identity;

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19 (B) Date of birth;

20 (C) Social Security number, or proof that the person is not eligible for a Social Security 21 number; and

22 (D) Lawful status in the United States; and

23 (c) Pays the fee described in section 5 of this 2017 Act.

(2) If an applicant changes the applicant's name, date of birth or Social Security number
after the department issues a Star ID to the applicant, the department may not replace or
renew the Star ID using the previous photograph unless the applicant submits documentation of the change, as required by rule by the department.

28 <u>SECTION 5.</u> <u>Star ID; fee.</u> (1) In addition to any fee imposed under ORS 807.370, 807.410 29 or 807.375, the Department of Transportation may impose a fee for each Star ID issued, re-30 newed or replaced, for the purpose of covering the costs of purchasing equipment and es-

tablishing and maintaining a database used for collecting and verifying documents presented 1 2 by the applicant pursuant to section 4 of this 2017 Act. (2) A fee imposed under this section may not be more than \$\_ 3 SECTION 6. Document retention. For the purpose of issuing, renewing or replacing Star 4 IDs only, the Department of Transportation shall: 5 (1) Capture digital images of identity source documents and retain the documents in a 6 transferable format. 7 (2) Retain paper copies of identity source documents for a minimum of seven years or 8 9 digital images of identity source documents for a minimum of 10 years. SECTION 7. Disclosure of identity source documents. (1) Except as provided in sub-10 section (2) of this section, an officer, employee or contractor of the Department of Trans-11 12 portation may not knowingly disclose, or otherwise make available to any person copies of, identity source documents submitted to the department in connection with an application for 13 a driver license, driver permit or identification card. 14 15 (2) An officer, employee or contractor of the department may make information or copies described in subsection (1) of this section available to law enforcement officials, motor vehi-16 cle agencies from other states and employees of the department acting in an official capacity. 17 18 SECTION 8. Fingerprint requirements. (1) The Department of Transportation may re-19 quire all employees or contractors authorized to manufacture or produce driver licenses, 20 driver permits or identification cards to be fingerprinted. (2) Fingerprints acquired under this section may be used for the purpose of requesting 2122state or nationwide criminal records checks under ORS 181A.195. 23SECTION 9. Comprehensive security plan. The Department of Transportation shall de-

velop and implement a comprehensive security plan to ensure the security and integrity of the department's employees, facilities and storage systems, the production of driver licenses, driver permits and identification cards and the collection and retention of personal information and identity source documents.

28 <u>SECTION 10.</u> <u>Recognition of fraudulent documents.</u> The Department of Transportation 29 shall require that all employees engaged in the issuing of driver licenses, driver permits and 30 identification cards are trained to recognize fraudulent documents.

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SECTION 11. ORS 802.179 is amended to read:

802.179. (1) The Department of Transportation, upon request or as required by law, shall disclose
personal information from a motor vehicle record to a government agency for use in carrying out
its governmental functions.

(2) The department shall disclose personal information from a motor vehicle record for use in connection with matters of motor vehicle or driver safety and theft, motor vehicle emissions, motor vehicle product alterations, recalls or advisories, performance monitoring of motor vehicles and dealers by motor vehicle manufacturers, and removal of nonowner records from the original owner records of motor vehicle manufacturers to carry out the purposes of any of the following federal Acts:

41 (a) The Automobile Information Disclosure Act.

42 (b) The Motor Vehicle Information and Cost Saving Act.

43 (c) The National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966.

44 (d) The Anti-Car Theft Act of 1992.

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(f) The Real ID Act of 2005. 1 2 (3)(a) If the department determines that a business is a legitimate business, the department shall 3 disclose personal information to the business for use in the normal course of business in: (A) Verifying the accuracy of personal information submitted to the business; or 4  $\mathbf{5}$ (B) Correcting personal information submitted to the business, but only in order to: (i) Prevent fraud; 6 (ii) Pursue legal remedies against the individual who submitted the personal information; or 7 (iii) Recover a debt from, or satisfy a security interest against, the individual. 8 9 (b) The department shall adopt rules specifying the kind of information that the department will accept as evidence that a business is a legitimate business. 10 (4) The department shall disclose personal information to: 11 12(a) An attorney, a financial institution as defined in ORS chapter 706 or a collection agency 13 registered under ORS 697.031 for use in connection with a civil, criminal, administrative or arbitration proceeding in any court, government agency or self-regulatory body. (5) The department shall disclose personal information other than names to a researcher for use in researching health and educational questions and providing statistical reports, as long as the personal information is not published, redisclosed or used to contact individuals. The department may disclose information under this subsection only for research sponsored by an educational institution or a health research institution.

(6) The department shall disclose personal information to an insurer, an insurance support or ganization or a self-insured entity in connection with claims investigation activities, antifraud ac tivities, underwriting or rating.

(7) The department shall disclose personal information regarding ownership or other financial interests in a vehicle to a person who is required by the state or federal Constitution, a statute or an ordinance to give notice to another person concerning the vehicle. Personal information disclosed under this subsection may be used only for giving the required notice. Persons authorized to receive personal information under this subsection include, but are not limited to:

35 (a) Tow companies;

36 (b) Persons who have or are entitled to have liens on the vehicle; and

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(c) Persons taking an action that could affect ownership rights to the vehicle.

(8) The department shall disclose personal information to any private security professional certified under ORS 181A.870, to be used for the purpose of determining ownership of vehicles parked
in a place over which the private security professional, acting within the scope of the professional's
employment, exercises control.

42 (9) The department shall disclose personal information to the employer of an individual who
43 holds commercial driving privileges, or the insurer of the employer, to obtain or verify information
44 about the individual.

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(10) The department shall disclose personal information to the operator of a private toll facility

1 for use in collecting tolls.

2 (11) The department may not disclose personal information for bulk distributors of surveys, 3 marketing materials or solicitations except as provided in this subsection. The department shall 4 implement methods and procedures to ensure:

5 (a) That individuals are offered an opportunity to request that personal information about 6 themselves be disclosed to bulk distributors; and

(b) That the personal information provided by the department will be used, rented or sold solely
for bulk distribution of surveys, marketing materials and solicitations.

9 (12) The department shall disclose personal information to a person who requests the informa-10 tion if the requester provides the department with written permission from the individual whose 11 personal information is requested. The written permission from the individual must be notarized.

(13) The department shall disclose personal information to a person who is in the business ofdisseminating such information under the following conditions:

(a) In addition to any other requirements under the contract executed pursuant to paragraph (b)
of this subsection, the person requesting the information must file a performance bond with the department in the amount of \$25,000. The bond must be executed in favor of the State of Oregon and
its form is subject to approval by the Attorney General.

(b) The disseminator shall enter into a contract with the department. A contract under thisparagraph shall contain at least the following provisions:

20 (A) That the disseminator will not reproduce or distribute the personal information in bulk but 21 only in response to an individual record inquiry.

(B) That the disseminator will provide the personal information only to a person or government
agency authorized to receive the information under this section and only if the person or government
ment agency has been authorized by the department to receive the information.

(C) That the disseminator will have a method of ensuring that the disseminator can delay for a period of up to two days the giving of personal information to a requester who is not a subscriber.

(14) The department shall disclose personal information to representatives of the news media for
the gathering or dissemination of information related to the operation of a motor vehicle or to public
safety.

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(15) The department shall disclose personal information as provided in ORS 802.220 (5).

(16) The department shall adopt rules providing for the release of personal information from motor vehicle records to a person who has a financial interest in the vehicle. Rules adopted under this subsection may include, but need not be limited to, rules establishing procedures for the department to verify the financial interest of the person making the request for personal information.

(17) The department shall adopt rules providing for the release of personal information from motor vehicle records to a person who is injured by the unsafe operation of a vehicle or who owns property that is damaged because of the unsafe operation of a vehicle.

(18) The department shall disclose personal information to a private investigator licensed by any licensing authority within the State of Oregon, to be used for any purpose permitted under this section. A licensed private investigator requesting information must prove to the department that the person has a corporate surety bond, an irrevocable letter of credit issued by an insured institution as defined in ORS 706.008 or such other security as the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training may prescribe by rule in the minimum amount of \$5,000 or errors and omissions insurance in the minimum amount of \$5,000.

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(19) The department shall disclose personal information to a procurement organization as de-

1 fined in ORS 97.953 for the purpose of facilitating the making of anatomical gifts under the pro-

2 visions of ORS 97.955.

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SECTION 12. ORS 807.022 is amended to read:

4 807.022. (1) [*Prior to*] **Before** issuing, renewing or replacing a driver license, driver permit or 5 identification card, the Department of Transportation may verify with the issuing agency the valid-6 ity and completeness of each identity source document presented by the applicant.

7 (2) The department may require a person who is the holder of a current, valid driver li-8 cense, driver permit or identification card who previously presented an identity source doc-9 ument that was not retained by the department as a digital image to present an identity 10 source document for the purpose of capturing and retaining a digital copy of the identity 11 source document. This subsection applies only to a person who elects to hold a Star ID.

12 **SECTION 13.** ORS 807.024 is amended to read:

13 807.024. (1) A person who applies for issuance, renewal or replacement of a driver license, driver 14 permit or identification card shall submit to collection of biometric data by the Department of 15 Transportation for the purpose of establishing the person's identity. Submitting to collection of 16 biometric data under this section does not excuse a person from responsibility for complying with 17 requirements for proof of identity, [age or residence] date of birth or address pursuant to ORS 18 [807.050] 807.040 or proof of legal presence under ORS 807.021.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section and ORS 807.040 (1)(c), the department, by
 rule, may provide for issuance, renewal or replacement of a valid driver license or driver permit
 without the collection of biometric data.

(3) For purposes of this section, a person's identity is established if:

(a) The department finds that the biometric data collected as required under subsection (1) of
this section match the biometric data that are already in the department's records for that person;
or

(b) The department finds that the biometric data collected as required under subsection (1) of this section do not match biometric data in the department's records for any other person and the department does not otherwise have reason to believe that the person is not who the person claims to be.

(4) If a person's identity is established as described in subsection (3) of this section, the department shall mail the driver license, driver permit or identification card to the address provided
by the person when the person applied for the issuance, renewal or replacement of the license,
permit or identification card.

(5) If a person's identity is not established as described in subsection (3) of this section, thedepartment shall:

(a) Inform the person who submitted to collection of biometric data that the person's identity
 was not established; and

(b) Provide the person with the opportunity to establish the person's identity by an alternativemethod approved by the department by rule.

(6) If a person's identity was not established as described in subsection (3) of this section and the department has reason to believe that the crime of identity theft, as described in ORS 165.800, was committed by the person currently submitting to collection of biometric data or by a person who previously submitted to collection of biometric data under the identity of the person currently submitting to collection of biometric data, the department shall notify a law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction over the crime.

(7) The department by rule shall establish procedures for providing expedited processing of 1 2 driver licenses, driver permits or identification cards.

3 (8) The department and employees of the department are immune from liability for any damages resulting from the issuance, renewal or replacement of a driver license, driver permit or identifica-4 tion card under another person's identity if the employee who processed the biometric data for a 5 license, permit or identification card established the applicant's identity as described in subsection 6 (3) of this section. 7

9 807.040. (1) The Department of Transportation shall issue a driver license to any person who 10 complies with all of the following requirements:

11 (a) The person must complete an application for a license under ORS 807.050.

12(b) As required by ORS 807.021 and 807.730, the person must provide the Social Security number 13 assigned to the person by the United States Social Security Administration and proof of legal presence in the United States or, if the person is not eligible for a Social Security number, proof of legal 14 15 presence in the United States and proof that the person is not eligible for a Social Security number. 16 (c) The person must submit to collection of biometric data by the department that establish the identity of the person as described in ORS 807.024. 17

18 (d) The person must not be ineligible for the license under ORS 807.060 and must be eligible for the license under ORS 807.062. 19

(e) The person must successfully pass all examination requirements under ORS 807.070 for the 20class of license sought. 21

22(f) The person must pay the appropriate license fee under ORS 807.370 for the class of license 23sought.

(g) The person must pay the Student Driver Training Fund eligibility fee. 24

(13) An identification card becomes invalid if the holder of the card changes the holder's name from that shown on the card, including a change of name by marriage, without providing the department with notice of the change as required under ORS 807.420. Upon receiving such notice and the old identification card, the department shall issue a replacement identification card upon payment of the fee required under ORS 807.410.

(14) In the event that, for a reason identified by the department by rule, a person needs a replacement identification card that bears a distinguishing number different from the number on the card being replaced, the person to whom the card was issued may obtain a replacement card from the department upon furnishing proof satisfactory to the department of the need for such replacement and payment of the replacement fee under ORS 807.410.

(15) If a person furnishes proof that the person is a veteran, as defined in ORS 408.225, and the person's identification card does not include the fact that the person is a veteran, the department shall issue a replacement identification card that includes the fact that the person is a veteran.

(16) The department may establish by rule reasons for issuing replacement identification cards
that are in addition to the reasons identified in subsections (12) to (15) of this section. The fee for
a replacement identification card is provided under ORS 807.410.

(17) Upon cancellation of an identification card, the card is terminated and must be surrendered to the department. An identification card may be canceled for any of the reasons that driving privileges or a driver license may be canceled under ORS 809.310. The department may reissue an identification card canceled under this subsection when the applicant has satisfied all requirements for the identification card.

(18) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the department may issue an identification card to a person under this subsection without charge when the person surrenders the person's driver license or driver permit to the department for reasons described in this subsection. If the department issues an identification card under this subsection, the identification card shall expire at the same time as the surrendered driver license or driver permit would have expired. An  $\rm SB~374$ 

1 identification card issued under this subsection is subject to the same requirements and fees for 2 renewal or upon expiration as any other identification card issued under this section. The depart-

3 ment may issue identification cards under this subsection for any of the following reasons:

4 (a) The person voluntarily surrenders the person's driver license or driver permit to the de-5 partment based upon the person's recognition that the person is no longer competent to drive.

6 (b) The person's driving privileges are suspended under ORS 809.419 (1). This paragraph only 7 applies if the person voluntarily surrenders the person's driver license or driver permit to the de-8 partment as provided under ORS 809.500.

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SECTION 19. ORS 807.730 is amended to read:

10 807.730. (1) The Department of Transportation may issue or replace a limited term driver li-11 cense, limited term driver permit or limited term identification card only for a person who provides 12 proof, as determined by the department by rule, that the person is legally present in the United 13 States on a temporary basis.

14 (2) A limited term driver license or limited term identification card is valid:

(a) During the applicant's authorized stay in the United States, but no longer than eight years
 from the date of issuance; or

17 (b) If there is no definite end to the authorized stay, for a period of one year.

18 (3) A limited term driver permit is valid:

(a) During the applicant's authorized stay in the United States, but no longer than the periodof time for which a driver permit of the same type is issued by the department.

(b) If there is no definite end to the authorized stay, for a period of one year but no longer than
the period of time for which a driver permit of the same type is issued by the department.

(4) A limited term driver license, limited term driver permit or limited term identification card
may be renewed only upon presentation of valid documentation, as determined by the department
by rule, that the status by which the applicant qualified for the limited term driver license, limited
term driver permit or limited term identification card has been extended or is still in effect.

(5) A limited term driver license or limited term driver permit grants the same privileges as a
 driver license or driver permit.

(6) A limited term identification card shall bear a statement to the effect that the limited term
identification card is not a license or any other grant of driving privileges to operate a motor vehicle and is to be used for identification purposes only.

(7) A limited term driver license or limited term identification card shall clearly indicate
 that it is a limited term driver license or limited term identification card and indicate the
 date on which it expires.
