# A-Engrossed Senate Bill 380

Ordered by the Senate May 1 Including Senate Amendments dated May 1

Sponsored by Senator HANSELL; Senators BOQUIST, OLSEN, Representative BARRETO (at the request of J.P. Bailey) (Presession filed.)

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires State Parks and Recreation [Commission] **Department** to [allow disabled veterans to make reservations for use of state park areas one month prior to reservation system being made available to general public.] set aside certain number of campsites to be available for reservation only by disabled veterans during first 30 days of any applicable reservation period.

Requires department to report on implementation of rules for setting aside campsites for reservation by disabled veterans to Senate Committee on Veterans and Emergency Preparedness on or before February 15, 2018. Becomes operative January 1, 2018.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to reservations for use of state parks; creating new provisions; amending ORS 390.124; and

3 prescribing an effective date.

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### 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

**SECTION 1.** ORS 390.124 is amended to read:

6 390.124. (1) In accordance with any applicable provision of ORS chapter 183, the State Parks and 7 Recreation Commission may adopt rules necessary to carry out the duties, functions and powers 8 imposed by law upon the commission and the State Parks and Recreation Department. Rules adopted

9 pursuant to this section shall be duly entered in the minutes and records of the commission.

10 (2) The commission may adopt rules that assess reasonable charges for the use of areas estab-11 lished and maintained by the department. The department may also adopt rules establishing re-12 ductions in waivers of or exemption from the charges. However, the commission shall authorize the 13 use of any state park, individual campsite or day use fee area without charge:

(a) Upon the showing of proper identification, by a person maintaining a foster home, as defined
by ORS 418.625, and the person's children, when accompanied by a foster child residing in the home.

16 (b) Upon the showing of proper identification, by a person maintaining a developmental disabil-17 ity child foster home, as defined by ORS 443.830, and the person's children, when accompanied by

18 a foster child residing in the home.

(c) If a deed to, lease of or contract to use the property used as a state park, campsite or dayuse fee area prohibits the charging of fees for use of the property.

(d) Upon the showing of proper identification, by either a disabled veteran or a person on leave
 from military active duty status on Memorial Day, Independence Day or Veterans Day.

23 (3) If the commission adopts rules that allow a person to make reservations for the use

of campsites established and maintained by the department, the rules shall require the department to identify and set aside 10 percent of the campsites available at each state park where campsite reservations are permitted, or four campsites, whichever is more, to be available only for reservation, upon the showing of proper identification, by a disabled veteran. The restriction on reservations under this subsection shall apply only during the first 30 days of any applicable reservation period.

[(3)] (4) The commission shall adopt any rules pursuant to ORS chapter 183 that the commission
considers necessary to carry out ORS 273.563 to 273.591.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> On or before February 15, 2018, the State Parks and Recreation Department
 shall report to the Senate Committee on Veterans and Emergency Preparedness in the
 manner provided in ORS 192.245 on implementation of the amendments to ORS 390.124 by
 section 1 of this 2017 Act.

13 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Section 2 of this 2017 Act is repealed on January 2, 2019.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The amendments to ORS 390.124 by section 1 of this 2017 Act become
 operative January 1, 2018.

16 (2) The State Parks and Recreation Commission and the State Parks and Recreation 17 Department may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this 18 section that is necessary to enable the commission and the department to exercise, on and 19 after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions 20 and powers conferred on the commission and the department by the amendments to ORS 21 390.124 by section 1 of this 2017 Act.

22 <u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 23 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
