

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 48

By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES

- 1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 6 through 28 and delete pages 2 through 5 and insert:
- 2 **“SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, ‘board’ means:**
- 3 **“(a) Occupational Therapy Licensing Board;**
- 4 **“(b) Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists;**
- 5 **“(c) Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine;**
- 6 **“(d) Oregon Medical Board;**
- 7 **“(e) Oregon State Board of Nursing;**
- 8 **“(f) Physical Therapist Licensing Board;**
- 9 **“(g) State Board of Chiropractic Examiners;**
- 10 **“(h) State Board of Licensed Social Workers;**
- 11 **“(i) State Board of Psychologist Examiners; and**
- 12 **“(j) Teacher Standards and Practices Commission.**
- 13 **“(2) In collaboration with the Oregon Health Authority, a board shall adopt rules to re-**
- 14 **quire a person authorized to practice a profession listed in subsection (3) of this section to**
- 15 **report to the board, upon reauthorization to practice, the person’s completion of any con-**
- 16 **tinuing education regarding suicide risk assessment, treatment and management that is ap-**
- 17 **proved by the authority under section 2 of this 2017 Act and by the board.**
- 18 **“(3) A person authorized to practice one of the following professions shall report the**
- 19 **completion of any continuing education described in subsection (2) of this section to the**
- 20 **board that authorizes the person to practice as a:**
- 21 **“(a) Clinical social worker, as defined in ORS 675.510;**
- 22 **“(b) Licensed marriage and family therapist, as defined in ORS 675.705;**
- 23 **“(c) Licensed professional counselor, as defined in ORS 675.705;**
- 24 **“(d) Licensed psychologist, as defined in ORS 675.010;**
- 25 **“(e) Occupational therapist, as defined in ORS 675.210;**
- 26 **“(f) Regulated social worker, as defined in ORS 675.510;**
- 27 **“(g) School counselor, as defined by rule by the Teacher Standards and Practices Com-**
- 28 **mission;**
- 29 **“(h) Certified registered nurse anesthetist, as defined in ORS 678.245;**
- 30 **“(i) Chiropractic physician, as defined in ORS 684.010;**
- 31 **“(j) Clinical nurse specialist, as defined in ORS 678.010;**
- 32 **“(k) Naturopathic physician, as defined in ORS 685.010;**
- 33 **“(L) Nurse practitioner, as defined in ORS 678.010;**
- 34 **“(m) Physician, as defined in ORS 677.010;**
- 35 **“(n) Physician assistant, as defined in ORS 677.495;**

1       “(o) Physical therapist, as defined in ORS 688.010; and

2       “(p) Physical therapist assistant, as defined in ORS 688.010.

3       “(4)(a) A board shall document completion of any approved continuing education de-  
4 scribed in subsection (2) of this section by persons authorized by the board to practice a  
5 profession listed in subsection (3) of this section. The board shall document the following  
6 data:

7       “(A) The number of persons authorized to practice a profession listed in subsection (3)  
8 of this section who complete approved continuing education described in subsection (2) of  
9 this section;

10       “(B) The percentage of the total number of all persons authorized to practice a profession  
11 listed in subsection (3) of this section who complete the approved continuing education;

12       “(C) The cities and counties in which persons who complete the approved continuing ed-  
13 ucation practice;

14       “(D) Whether the approved continuing education opportunities were presented in person  
15 or through electronic means;

16       “(E) The names of the professional associations or other organizations offering the ap-  
17 proved continuing education opportunities; and

18       “(F) The number of hours of approved continuing education completed by persons au-  
19 thorized by the board to practice.

20       “(b) The board shall remove any personally identifying information from the data sub-  
21 mitted to the board under this subsection.

22       “(c) For purposes of documenting completion of continuing education under this sub-  
23 section, a board may adopt rules requiring persons authorized by the board to practice to  
24 submit documentation of completion to the board.

25       “(5) A board shall report annually to the authority on the data documented under sub-  
26 section (4) of this section.

27       “(6) The authority, on or before August 1 of each even-numbered year, shall report to the  
28 interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to health care on the information  
29 submitted to the authority under subsection (5) of this section.

30       “**SECTION 2.** (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall approve continuing education op-  
31 portunities related to suicide risk assessment, treatment and management.

32       “(2) The authority shall develop a list of continuing education opportunities related to  
33 suicide risk assessment, treatment and management and make the list available to each  
34 board, as defined in section 1 of this 2017 Act.

35       “(3) In developing the list, the authority shall:

36       “(a) Consider suicide risk assessment, treatment and management training programs  
37 recommended by organizations that provide suicide awareness advocacy and education; and

38       “(b) Consult with institutions of higher education and experts in suicide risk assessment,  
39 treatment and management.

40       “**SECTION 3.** ORS 675.140, as amended by section 3, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
41 amended to read:

42       “675.140. On or before the 10th day of each month, the State Board of Psychologist Examiners  
43 shall pay into the State Treasury all moneys received by the board during the preceding calendar  
44 month. The State Treasurer shall credit the moneys to the State Board of Psychologist Examiners  
45 Account. The moneys in the State Board of Psychologist Examiners Account are continuously ap-

1 appropriated to the board for the purpose of paying the expenses of administering and enforcing ORS  
2 675.010 to 675.150 and 676.850 **and section 1 of this 2017 Act.**

3 **“SECTION 4.** ORS 675.330, as amended by section 4, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
4 amended to read:

5 “675.330. (1) The Occupational Therapy Licensing Board Account is established in the State  
6 Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. All moneys received by the Occupational  
7 Therapy Licensing Board under ORS 675.210 to 675.340 shall be deposited into the account and are  
8 continuously appropriated to the board to be used only for the administration and enforcement of  
9 ORS 675.210 to 675.340, 675.990 (2) and 676.850 **and section 1 of this 2017 Act.** Any interest or  
10 other income from moneys in the account shall be credited to the account.

11 “(2) All civil penalties collected or received for violations of or in prosecutions under ORS  
12 675.210 to 675.340 shall be deposited into the Occupational Therapy Licensing Board Account and  
13 shall be used only for the administration and enforcement of ORS 675.210 to 675.340.

14 **“SECTION 5.** ORS 675.597, as amended by section 5, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
15 amended to read:

16 “675.597. The State Board of Licensed Social Workers Account is established in the State  
17 Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. Interest earned by the State Board of Li-  
18 censed Social Workers Account shall be credited to the account. Moneys in the account are con-  
19 tinuously appropriated to the board for the administration and enforcement of ORS 675.510 to  
20 675.600 and 676.850 **and section 1 of this 2017 Act.**

21 **“SECTION 6.** ORS 675.805, as amended by section 6, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
22 amended to read:

23 “675.805. All moneys received by the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and  
24 Therapists under ORS 675.715 to 675.835 shall be paid into the General Fund in the State Treasury  
25 and placed to the credit of the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists  
26 Account, which is hereby established. Such moneys are appropriated continuously and shall be used  
27 only for the administration and enforcement of ORS 675.715 to 675.835 and 676.850 **and section 1**  
28 **of this 2017 Act.**

29 **“SECTION 7.** ORS 677.290, as amended by section 8, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
30 amended to read:

31 “677.290. (1) All moneys received by the Oregon Medical Board under this chapter shall be paid  
32 into the General Fund in the State Treasury and placed to the credit of the Oregon Medical Board  
33 Account which is established. Such moneys are appropriated continuously and shall be used only for  
34 the administration and enforcement of this chapter and ORS 676.850 **and section 1 of this 2017**  
35 **Act.**

36 “(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, the board may maintain a revolving account  
37 in a sum not to exceed \$50,000 for the purpose of receiving and paying pass-through moneys relating  
38 to peer review pursuant to its duties under ORS 441.055 (4) and (5) and in administering programs  
39 pursuant to its duties under this chapter relating to the education and rehabilitation of licensees in  
40 the areas of chemical substance abuse, inappropriate prescribing and medical competence. The cre-  
41 ation of and disbursement of moneys from the revolving account shall not require an allotment or  
42 allocation of moneys pursuant to ORS 291.234 to 291.260. All moneys in the account are continuously  
43 appropriated for purposes set forth in this subsection.

44 “(3) Each year \$10 shall be paid to the Oregon Health and Science University for each in-state  
45 physician licensed under this chapter, which amount is continuously appropriated to the Oregon

1 Health and Science University to be used in maintaining a circulating library of medical and surgi-  
2 cal books and publications for the use of practitioners of medicine in this state, and when not so in  
3 use to be kept at the library of the School of Medicine and accessible to its students. The balance  
4 of the money received by the board is appropriated continuously and shall be used only for the ad-  
5 ministration and enforcement of this chapter, but any part of the balance may, upon the order of the  
6 board, be paid into the circulating library fund.

7 “**SECTION 8.** ORS 678.170, as amended by section 9, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
8 amended to read:

9 “678.170. (1) All money received by the Oregon State Board of Nursing under ORS 678.010 to  
10 678.448 shall be paid into the General Fund in the State Treasury and placed to the credit of the  
11 Oregon State Board of Nursing Account. Such moneys are appropriated continuously and shall be  
12 used only for the administration and enforcement of ORS 676.850 and 678.010 to 678.448 **and section**  
13 **1 of this 2017 Act.**

14 “(2) The board shall keep a record of all moneys deposited in the Oregon State Board of Nursing  
15 Account. This record shall indicate by separate cumulative accounts the source from which the  
16 moneys are derived and the individual activity or program against which each withdrawal is  
17 charged.

18 “(3) The board may maintain a petty cash fund in compliance with ORS 293.180 in the amount  
19 of \$1,000.

20 “**SECTION 9.** ORS 684.171, as amended by section 13, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
21 amended to read:

22 “684.171. All moneys received by the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners under this chapter  
23 shall be paid into the General Fund in the State Treasury and placed to the credit of the State  
24 Board of Chiropractic Examiners Account which is hereby established and such moneys are appro-  
25 priated continuously and shall be used only for the administration and enforcement of this chapter  
26 and ORS 676.850 **and section 1 of this 2017 Act.**

27 “**SECTION 10.** ORS 685.201, as amended by section 14, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, is  
28 amended to read:

29 “685.201. The Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine Account is established in the State  
30 Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund. All moneys received by the Oregon Board  
31 of Naturopathic Medicine under this chapter shall be deposited into the account and are contin-  
32 uously appropriated to the board to be used only for the administration and enforcement of this  
33 chapter and ORS 676.850 **and section 1 of this 2017 Act.** Any interest or other income from moneys  
34 in the account shall be credited to the account.

35 “**SECTION 11.** ORS 688.201, as amended by section 16, chapter 240, Oregon Laws 2013, and  
36 section 8, chapter 13, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:

37 “688.201. (1) All moneys received under ORS 688.010 to 688.201 shall be paid into an account  
38 established by the Physical Therapist Licensing Board under ORS 182.470. The board may establish  
39 an additional account under ORS 182.470 for the purpose of meeting financial obligations imposed  
40 on the State of Oregon as a result of this state’s participation in the Physical Therapy Licensure  
41 Compact established under section 1, chapter 13, Oregon Laws 2016.

42 “(2) The moneys paid into the accounts established by the board under ORS 182.470 are con-  
43 tinuously appropriated to the board and may be used only for the administration and enforcement  
44 of ORS 676.850 and 688.010 to 688.201 **and section 1 of this 2017 Act** and for the purpose of meeting  
45 financial obligations imposed on the State of Oregon as a result of this state’s participation in the

1 Physical Therapy Licensure Compact established under section 1, chapter 13, Oregon Laws 2016.

2 **“SECTION 12. (1) Sections 1 and 2 of this 2017 Act and the amendments to ORS 675.140,**  
3 **675.330, 675.597, 675.805, 677.290, 678.170, 684.171, 685.201 and 688.201 by sections 3 to 11 of this**  
4 **2017 Act become operative on January 1, 2018.**

5 **“(2) A board, as defined in section 1 of this 2017 Act, and the Oregon Health Authority**  
6 **may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that**  
7 **is necessary to enable the board and the authority to exercise, on or after the operative date**  
8 **specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred**  
9 **on the board and the authority by sections 1 and 2 of this 2017 Act and the amendments to**  
10 **ORS 675.140, 675.330, 675.597, 675.805, 677.290, 678.170, 684.171, 685.201 and 688.201 by sections**  
11 **3 to 11 of this 2017 Act.**

12 **“SECTION 13. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
13 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect**  
14 **on its passage.”.**

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
