

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5512

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 27 and delete page 2 and insert:

2 “**SECTION 1.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
3 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment
4 of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but ex-
5 cluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Consumer
6 and Business Services for the following purposes:

- 7 (1) **Workers’ Compensation**
- 8 Board \$ 24,734,955
- 9 (2) **Workers’ Compensation**
- 10 Division \$ 43,130,865
- 11 (3) **Oregon OSHA.....** \$ 42,665,924
- 12 (4) **Central Services Division.....** \$ 40,413,675
- 13 (5) **Division of Financial**
- 14 **Regulation.....** \$ 46,213,993
- 15 (6) **Building Codes Division** \$ 36,125,080

16 “**SECTION 2.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
17 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment
18 of expenses by the Department of Consumer and Business Services from the Health Insur-
19 ance Exchange Fund established by ORS 741.102 for the following purposes:

- 20 (1) **Marketplace Division** \$ 14,917,407
- 21 (2) **Central Services Division.....** \$ 1,012,108

22 “**SECTION 3.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, \$1,383,290 is estab-
23 lished for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses
24 for the COFA Premium Assistance Program from the COFA Premium Assistance Program
25 Fund established by section 5, chapter 94, Oregon Laws 2016.

26 “**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts
27 are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment
28 of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Department of Consumer and
29 Business Services for the following purposes:

- 30 (1) **Oregon OSHA.....** \$ 12,990,316
- 31 (2) **Senior Health Insurance**
- 32 **Benefit Assistance Program** \$ 1,400,186
- 33 (3) **Central Services Division.....** \$ 297,182
- 34 (4) **Building Codes Division** \$ 253,610

35 “**SECTION 5.** For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, the following expenditures by the

1 Department of Consumer and Business Services are not limited:

2 “(1) Expenditures from the Workers’ Benefit Fund;

3 “(2) Expenditures from the Self-Insured Employer Adjustment Reserve;

4 “(3) Expenditures from the Self-Insured Employer Group Adjustment Reserve;

5 “(4) Expenditures from the Consumer and Business Services Fund for payment of con-
6 tracted collection costs, including contracted processing costs for the Combined Payroll Tax
7 Reporting Program, contracted building codes permit issuance costs and workers’ compen-
8 sation paying agent reimbursements as described in ORS 656.307;

9 “(5) Expenditures from the Funeral and Cemetery Consumer Protection Trust Fund; and

10 “(6) Special payments to Oregon Health and Science University for research on occupa-
11 tional illness and disease.

12 “SECTION 6. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
13 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect
14 July 1, 2017.”.

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
