SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for State School Fund. Limits biennial expenditures from lottery moneys allocated from Administrative Services Eco-

nomic Development Fund to department for State School Fund.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department for State School Fund.

Specifies amounts department may spend for certain purposes from State School Fund.

Specifies, for 2017 and 2018 fiscal years, total amount that department may spend from State School Fund.

Transfers moneys from State School Fund to Local Option Equalization Grants Account. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2017.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-

ated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, out of the
 General Fund, the amount of \$7,684,226,325 for the State School Fund.

7 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 8 \$452,292,849 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for 9 payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Eco-

10 nomic Development Fund to the Department of Education for the State School Fund.

11 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of 12 \$67,341,193 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for 13 payment of expenses by the Department of Education from fees, moneys or other revenues, 14 including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or 15 received by the Department of Education for the State School Fund.

16 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding ORS 327.008 and 327.013, for the biennium beginning July
 17 1, 2017, the Department of Education:

(1) May spend up to \$968,000 from the State School Fund for the contract described in
 ORS 329.488.

20 (2) May spend up to \$1,600,000 from the State School Fund for purposes related to the

22 (3) May spend up to \$2,470,000 from the State School Fund to provide lunches, at no

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charge to the student, to students who are eligible for reduced price lunches under the

3 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) The Department of Education may not spend more than \$4,101,930,184

4 from the State School Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017.

5 (2) The Department of Education may not spend more than \$4,101,930,184 from the State
6 School Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> The amount of \$3,860,367 is transferred from the State School Fund to the
 Local Option Equalization Grants Account created in ORS 327.339.

9 <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect
 July 1, 2017.

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
