SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for biennial expenses.

Limits biennial expenditures by commission from lottery moneys for debt service on lottery bonds.

Limits biennial expenditures by commission from lottery moneys allocated from Education Stability Fund for Oregon Opportunity Grants.

Limits biennial expenditures by commission from lottery moneys for Outdoor School Education

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by commission for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures of commission from federal funds for certain purposes.

Limits biennial expenditures of commission from bond proceeds and other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by commission for grant to Linn-Benton Community College.

Limits biennial expenditures by commission from lottery moneys allocated from Sports Lottery Account for public universities.

Limits biennial expenditures by commission from timber tax funds for Community College Support Fund.

Authorizes specified nonlimited expenditures. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2017.

 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$31,921,630 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon public universities.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$11,733,159 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on lottery bonds sold for the benefit of Oregon community colleges.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$20,746,268 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Education Stability Fund to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon Opportunity Grants.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$24,000,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Outdoor School Education Fund.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds, federal funds and funds described in sections 9 and 10 of this 2017 Act, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the following purposes:

<u>SECTION 7.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from federal funds collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, for the following purposes:

SECTION 8. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$1,500,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from bond proceeds and other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from the proceeds of lottery bonds for the purposes of a grant to Linn-Benton Community College for the Advanced Transportation Technology Center.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$8,240,000 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from lottery moneys allocated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from the Sports Lottery Account for the benefit of Oregon public universities.

SECTION 10. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$45,810 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission from the moneys received from the Western Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund and the Eastern Oregon Timber Severance Tax Fund for the Community College Support Fund.

SECTION 11. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for debt service on general obligation bonds and certificates of participation issued for the benefit of public universities and paid with resources received from the public universities are not limited.

<u>SECTION 12.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for payments to individuals, organizations or units of government from federal National Emergency Grant funds are not limited.

<u>SECTION 13.</u> For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, expenditures by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for federal funds debt service on Build America Bonds sold

1	for the benefit of Oregon public universities and community colleges are not limited.
2	SECTION 14. For the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, expenditures by the Higher Edu-
3	cation Coordinating Commission of moneys from the Tuition Protection Fund are not limited.
4	SECTION 15. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
5	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect
6	July 1, 2017.
