## Senate Bill 555

Sponsored by Senator JOHNSON (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Exempts certain activities completed for purpose of maintaining drainage from removal or fill permit requirements.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 Relating to the maintenance of agricultural drainage. 2 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 196.600 to 4 196.905. 5 6 SECTION 2 (1) ORS 196.810 does not apply to the following activities when completed for 7 the purpose of maintaining drainage and protecting agricultural land: 8 (a) The removal of no more than 200 cubic yards of material at any one individual site from waters of this state in a calendar year, including in essential indigenous anadromous 9 salmonid habitat. 10 (b) The fill of up to 200 cubic yards of material at any one individual site in waters of this 11 state, unless the fill activity is proposed in essential indigenous anadromous salmonid 12 habitat. 13 (2) In conducting a removal or fill activity authorized under this section a person must 14 comply with the following conditions: 15(a) The removal or fill activity must not result in the conversion of wetland to upland; 16 (b) The removal of woody vegetation must: 17 (A) Be limited to the minimum amount needed to complete the activity, including gaining 18 19 access to the removal site; and (B) Where practicable, be limited to the north and east sides of the stream channel; 20 (c) Equipment used to remove or fill material must operate from the top of the 2122streambank, where feasible, or otherwise from a dry position below the top of the 23 streambank; 24 (d) To the extent practicable, the activity must be implemented in a manner that na-25turally maintains inlet and outlet connections with the main stream channel; 26 (e) As necessary, erosion control measures must be installed and maintained during the 27activity and after disposal of material; and 28 (f) A removal activity occurring in essential indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat must be conducted during periods that minimize adverse effects to fish and wildlife in ac-29cordance with guidance provided by the State Department of Fish and Wildlife. 30 31 (3) As used in this section, "essential indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat" has the
