Senate Bill 56

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes Oregon Liquor Control Commission to require cannabis-related licensees, certificate holders and applicants for licenses and certificates to submit information related to persons who hold financial interest in business operating or to be operated under license or certificate.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to cannabis; and declaring an emergency.

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Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3

4 SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 3 of this 2017 Act are added to and made a part of ORS 5 475B.010 to 475B.395.

SECTION 2. (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission may require, in a form and 6 7 manner prescribed by the commission, a licensee or applicant for a license under ORS 8 475B.070, 475B.090, 475B.100 or 475B.110 to submit to the commission a sworn statement 9 showing:

(a) The name and address of each person that has a financial interest in the business 10 operating or to be operated under the license; and 11

12 (b) The nature and extent of the financial interest of each person that has a financial 13 interest in the business operating or to be operated under the license.

(2) The commission may refuse to issue, or may suspend, revoke or refuse to renew, a 14 15license issued under ORS 475B.070, 475B.090, 475B.100 or 475B.110 if the commission deter-16 mines that a person that has a financial interest in the business operating or to be operated under the license committed or failed to commit an act that would constitute grounds for 17the commission to refuse to issue, or to suspend, revoke or refuse to renew, the license if 18 19 the person were the licensee or applicant for the license.

SECTION 3. (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission may require, in a form and 20 21manner prescribed by the commission, a certificate holder or an applicant for a certificate under ORS 475B.235 to submit to the commission a sworn statement showing: 22

23(a) The name and address of each person that has a financial interest in the research 24 being conducted or to be conducted under the certificate; and

25(b) The nature and extent of the financial interest of each person that has a financial 26 interest in the research being conducted or to be conducted under the certificate.

27(2) The commission may refuse to issue, or may suspend, revoke or refuse to renew, a certificate issued under ORS 475B.235 if the commission determines that a person that has 2829 a financial interest in the research being conducted or to be conducted under the certificate 1 committed or failed to commit an act that would constitute grounds for the commission to 2 refuse to issue, or to suspend, revoke or refuse to renew, the certificate if the person were

3 the certificate holder or the applicant for the certificate.

4 <u>SECTION 4.</u> Section 5 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475B.550 to 5 475B.590.

6 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission may require, in a form and 7 manner prescribed by the commission, a licensee or applicant for a license under ORS 8 475B.560 to submit to the commission a sworn statement showing:

9 (a) The name and address of each person that has a financial interest in the business 10 operating or to be operated under the license; and

(b) The nature and extent of the financial interest of each person that has a financial
interest in the business operating or to be operated under the license.

13 (2) The commission may refuse to issue, or may suspend, revoke or refuse to renew, a 14 license issued under ORS 475B.560 if the commission determines that a person that has a 15 financial interest in the business operating or to be operated under the license committed 16 or failed to commit an act that would constitute grounds for the commission to refuse to 17 issue, or to suspend, revoke or refuse to renew, the license if the person were the licensee 18 or applicant for the license.

19 <u>SECTION 6.</u> This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 20 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect 21 on its passage.

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
