## Senate Bill 570

Sponsored by Senator KNOPP (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates crime of intentionally administering marijuana item to body of person who is under 18 years of age. Punishes by maximum of 20 years' imprisonment, \$375,000 fine, or both.

Creates crime of knowingly administering marijuana item to body of person who is under 18 years of age. Punishes by maximum of 1 year's imprisonment, \$6,250 fine, or both.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the unlawful administration of a marijuana item to the body of another; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 475B.010 to 475B.395.

SECTION 2. (1) Except as authorized under ORS 475B.010 to 475B.395, 475B.400 to 475B.525, 475B.550 to 475B.590 and 475B.600 to 475B.655 and rules adopted under ORS 475B.010 to 475B.395, 475B.400 to 475B.525, 475B.550 to 475B.590 and 475B.600 to 475B.655, it is unlawful for a person to intentionally or knowingly administer a marijuana item to the body of another person who is under 18 years of age by inhalation, ingestion or any other means.

- (2)(a) Intentionally administering a marijuana item to the body of a person who is under 18 years of age is a Class A felony.
- (b) Intentionally administering a marijuana item to the body of a person who is under 18 years of age shall be classified as a person felony and crime category 9 of the sentencing guidelines grid of the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.
- (3) Knowingly administering a marijuana item to the body of a person who is under 18 years of age is a Class A misdemeanor.
- (4) It is an affirmative defense to a charge of intentionally or knowingly administering a marijuana item to the body of a person who is under 18 years of age if:
- (a) The person administering the marijuana item was less than three years older than the other person at the time of the administration, and the other person consented to the administration; or
- (b) The marijuana item was administered for a medical purpose with the consent of the person under 18 years of age, and the person under 18 years of age was a registry identification cardholder as defined in ORS 475B.410 at the time of the administration.

SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.
