

# Senate Bill 575

Sponsored by Senator KNOPP (Presession filed.)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Adjusts manner in which attendance is calculated for purposes of State School Fund distributions.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2017.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to attendance for State School Fund distribution purposes; creating new provisions;  
3 amending ORS 327.006; and declaring an emergency.

4 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 327.006, as amended by section 8, chapter 7, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended  
6 to read:

7 327.006. As used in ORS 327.006 to 327.133, 327.348 and 327.731 and sections 1 to 3, chapter 735,  
8 Oregon Laws 2013:

9 (1) "Aggregate days membership" means the [*sum*] **total number** of days present [*and absent*],  
10 according to the rules of the State Board of Education, of all resident pupils when school is actually  
11 in session during a certain period. The aggregate days membership of kindergarten pupils shall be  
12 calculated on the basis of a half-day program for half-day kindergarten and on the basis of a full-day  
13 program for full-day kindergarten.

14 (2)(a) "Approved transportation costs" means those costs as defined by rule of the State Board  
15 of Education and is limited to those costs attributable to transporting or room and board provided  
16 in lieu of transporting:

17 (A) Elementary school students who live at least one mile from school;

18 (B) Secondary school students who live at least 1.5 miles from school;

19 (C) Any student required to be transported for health or safety reasons, according to supple-  
20 mental plans from districts that have been approved by the state board identifying students who are  
21 required to be transported for health or safety reasons, including special education;

22 (D) Preschool children with disabilities requiring transportation for early intervention services  
23 provided pursuant to ORS 343.224 and 343.533;

24 (E) Students who require payment of room and board in lieu of transportation;

25 (F) A student transported from one school or facility to another school or facility when the  
26 student attends both schools or facilities during the day or week; and

27 (G) Students participating in school-sponsored field trips that are extensions of classroom  
28 learning experiences.

29 (b) "Approved transportation costs" does not include the cost of constructing boarding school  
30 facilities.

31 (3) "Average daily membership" or "ADM" means the aggregate days membership of a school

1 during a certain period divided by the number of days the school was actually in session during the

 14 another district, as determined in accordance with the rules of the State Board of Education, but  
 15 net operating expenditures does not include transportation, food service, student body activities,  
 16 community services, capital outlay, debt service or expenses incurred for nonresident students.

17 (7)(a) "Resident pupil" means any pupil:

18 (A) Whose legal school residence is within the boundaries of a school district reporting the pu-  
 19 pil, if the district is legally responsible for the education of the pupil, except that "resident pupil"  
 20 does not include a pupil who pays tuition or for whom the parent pays tuition or for whom the  
 21 district does not pay tuition for placement outside the district; or

22 (B) Whose legal residence is not within the boundaries of the district reporting the pupil but  
 23 who attends school in the district with the written consent of the district school board where the

19 **SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 327.006 by sections 1 and 2 of this 2017 Act apply**  
 20 **to State School Fund distributions commencing with the 2017-2018 distributions.**

21 **SECTION 4. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
 22 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect**  
 23 **July 1, 2017.**
