Senate Bill 662

Sponsored by Senator OLSEN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Creates crime of causing an animal to ingest marijuana. Punishes by maximum of six months' imprisonment, \$6,500 fine, or both.

2	Relating to offenses against animals.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 167.310 to
5	167.340.
6	SECTION 2. (1) A person commits the crime of causing an animal to ingest marijuana
7	if the person knowingly causes an animal to ingest marijuana items.
8	(2) Causing an animal to ingest marijuana is a Class B misdemeanor. Notwithstanding
9	ORS 161.635 and 161.655, a person convicted under this section may be sentenced to pay a
10	fine, fixed by the court, not exceeding \$6,500.
11	(3) As used in this section:
12	(a) "Cannabinoid," "cannabinoid product" and "marijuana" have the meaning given those
13	terms in ORS 475B.015.
14	(b)(A) "Marijuana items" means marijuana, cannabinoid products, cannabinoid concen-
15	trates and cannabinoid extracts.
16	(B) "Marijuana items" does not include products administered by a veterinarian to an
17	animal for medicinal purposes that contain cannabidiol but do not contain
