Senate Bill 697

Sponsored by Senator KNOPP

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires annual timber harvest on state forestlands to equal or exceed specified percentage of annual amount of harvestable timber expected to be grown on state forestlands.

Applies to timber harvest and harvestable timber growth in calendar years beginning on or after January 1, 2018.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to minimum required timber harvest amounts for state forestlands.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) Except as provided under subsection (2) of this section, as part of managing state forestlands under ORS 530.050 to secure the greatest permanent value of those lands to the state, the State Forester shall manage state forestlands so that the annual timber harvest from each of the forestlands, measured in million board feet, is 80 percent or more of the annual amount of harvestable timber expected to be grown on the forestland under ORS 527.610 to 527.770.
 - (2) If harvesting on any state forestland cannot be conducted at a level that equals 80 percent or more of the annual amount of harvestable timber expected to be grown on the forestland, the State Forester shall manage harvesting on other state forestlands so that the statewide timber harvest from state forestlands, measured in million board feet, is 80 percent or more of the statewide annual amount of harvestable timber expected to be grown on state forestlands under ORS 527.610 to 527.770.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2017 Act applies to timber harvests and harvestable timber growth in years beginning on or after January 1, 2018.
