## Senate Bill 859

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of Rico Dence)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires physician to discuss issues related to fertility with adolescent oncology patient. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to oncology patients; and prescribing an effective date.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2017 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 677.

5 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) A physician who is licensed under this chapter and who practices 6 oncology shall discuss with the physician's patient issues relating to the patient's fertility if 7 the patient is an adolescent and will undergo chemotherapy, radiation treatment or other 8 treatment that poses a risk to the patient's fertility.

9 (2) If the patient is 17 years of age or younger, the physician shall obtain consent from 10 the patient's parent or legal guardian before discussing issues related to the patient's

11 fertility with the patient.

12 (3) The Oregon Medical Board shall adopt rules to carry out this section.

13 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) Section 2 of this 2017 Act becomes operative on January 1, 2018.

(2) The Oregon Medical Board may take any action before the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the board to exercise, on or after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers conferred on the board by section 2 of this 2017 Act.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017
regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
