Senate Bill 904

Sponsored by Senator BOQUIST

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes Joint Interim Legislative Committee to Review Education Programs in Oregon. Directs committee to study and compile data related to possible methods for reforming public education system. Requires report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to education no later than September 15, 2019. Allows committee to introduce legislation to implement recommendations.

Sunsets committee on December 31, 2019. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to an evaluation of education programs in Oregon; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Joint Interim Legislative Committee to Review Education Programs 5 in Oregon is established.

6 (2) The committee consists of six members appointed as follows:

7 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members from among members of the
8 Senate.

9 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three members from 10 among members of the House of Representatives.

(3) The committee shall research, study and compile data related to possible methods for
 reforming the public education system of this state. The committee shall consider:

- (a) The centralization of the hiring process for teachers, administrators and other school
 staff at the state level with advisory boards at the county level;
- (b) The centralization of the administration of education at the state level with advisory
 boards at the county level;
- (c) The consolidation of school districts in a manner that is similar to the geographic
 coverage or the population coverage of a county;

(d) The elimination of legislative academic requirements that are not critical to providing
 a quality education;

(e) Whether to offer an academic option that provides basic education until the 10th
 grade, followed by two years of vocational training;

23 (f) Whether online education can and should be expanded;

(g) How other countries can spend less money per student than Oregon and yet have
 students score higher on international tests;

26 (h) Why more rigorous standards for educator preparation programs have not resulted 27 in an increase in education quality;

28 (i) Whether educator preparation programs at public universities in this state should

prepare teachers in four years; 1 2 (j) How to prevent educator preparation programs from causing students to accrue significant debts while failing to prepare them to teach; 3 (k) Whether additional professional development for teachers has decreased the success 4 of students: 5 (L) How to reduce class sizes; and 6 (m) Any other information to be researched, studied and compiled by the committee as 7 established by the committee by rule. 8 9 (4) The committee may hold hearings and take testimony as necessary and appropriate for the performance of the committee's duties, functions and powers under subsection (3) 10 of this section. (5) The committee may not transact business unless a quorum is present. A quorum consists of a majority of committee members from the House of Representatives and a majority of committee members from the Senate. (6) Action by the committee requires the affirmative vote of a majority of committee Senate. (7) The committee shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 19 (8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective. 20(9) The committee shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 2122or of a majority of the members of the committee. 23(10) Members of the committee shall receive an amount equal to that authorized under ORS 171.072 from funds appropriated to the Legislative Assembly for each day spent in the 94 performance of their duties as members of the committee. 25(11) The committee may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the committee. 26(12) The committee may presession file legislation in the manner provided in ORS 171.130 indicate that it is introduced at the request of the committee. any recommendations for legislation must be revenue neutral. committee. consider necessary to perform their duties.
