## **Senate Concurrent Resolution 26**

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Recognizes Newberg as Camellia City of Oregon.

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| 2  | Whereas on April 4, 1949, Newberg's city council unanimously designated the camellia as the          |

| 4  | Whereas over 65 years ago, Newberg announced its inaugural Camellia Festival; and                    |
| 5  | Whereas Newberg residents have been long-standing enthusiasts and supporters of camellias on         |
| 6  | a regional, state and national level; and  |
| 7  | Whereas one such resident, Russel Gainer, who was an early promoter of Newberg's love of             |
| 8  | camellias, became the president of the Oregon Camellia Society and the Oregon-Washington state       |
| 9  | director of the American Camellia Society; and   |
| 10 | Whereas camellias grace the lawns and gardens of many homes throughout Newberg, and an               |
| 11 | active camellia society has partnered with the Newberg Downtown Coalition to showcase dozens         |
| 12 | of camellia species in specially labeled planters made of barrels from wineries throughout the area; |

| 14 | Whereas in 1997, Mayor Donna Proctor unveiled an official camellia flag for the city, which is       |
| 15 | displayed and flown regularly; and   |
| 16 | Whereas Newberg is the host of the 2017 American Camellia Society convention, to be held on          |
| 17 | April 5 to April 8 of this year; now, therefore,   |
| 18 | Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:                                   |
| 19 | That we, the members of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly, recognize Newberg as the             |
| 20 | Camellia City of Oregon.   |

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
