**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2664**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2 rest of the line and delete line 3 and insert “and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 through 17 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Legislative Policy and Research Director shall**
5 **develop recommendations for legislation establishing an extended stay**
6 **ambulatory surgical center license in this state. The recommen-**
7 **dations must be developed using:**

8 **“(a) Data and evidence-based best practices; and**

9 **“(b) A public process involving stakeholders representing the ge-**
10 **ographic diversity of this state and representing a broad range of in-**
11 **terests, including but not limited to:**

12 **“(A) Individuals representing ambulatory surgical centers;**

13 **“(B) Individuals representing hospitals, including a representative**
14 **of at least one rural hospital;**

15 **“(C) Physicians, nurses and other health care providers;**

16 **“(D) Individuals with expertise in patient safety;**

17 **“(E) Consumer advocates;**

18 **“(F) Individuals who purchase health care; and**

19 **“(G) The Health Licensing Office.**

20 **“(2) The recommendations must include but are not limited to the**
21 **following:**

1 “(a) An analysis of the need for extended stay ambulatory surgical
2 center licensees in this state and how the licensees would be expected
3 to:

4 “(A) Improve access to care by residents of this state;

5 “(B) Improve the quality of health care; and

6 “(C) Lower the cost of health care.

7 “(b) Standards to ensure patient safety, including but not limited
8 to:

9 “(A) Agreements for the transfer of patients from licensees to hos-
10 pitals or other health care providers, if appropriate;

11 “(B) Staffing standards, including standards for granting privileges,
12 conducting peer review and establishing adequate staffing levels; and

13 “(C) Building code requirements, standards for facilities and equip-
14 ment and siting of extended stay centers in terms of proximity to
15 ambulatory surgical centers and hospitals.

16 “(c) The structure of the Oregon Health Authority’s oversight of
17 the licensees, including but not limited to:

18 “(A) The need for additional staff and funding for the authority;

19 “(B) The fee structure;

20 “(C) A plan for implementation;

21 “(D) Protocols and procedures to ensure that patient safety and
22 outcomes data are available to the public in aggregate form; and

23 “(E) Applications and eligibility for licenses.

24 “(d) A timeline for requesting any necessary federal approval from
25 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

26 “(3) The Legislative Policy and Research Director shall compile the
27 recommendations and report the recommendations to the Legislative
28 Assembly no later than September 15, 2017.

29 “SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31,
30 2017.

1 **“SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate**
2 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
3 **declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
