

Requested by Representative BARKER

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2812**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon insert “creating new  
2 provisions; amending section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014;”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 10 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

5 **“(a) ‘Suicidal behavior’ means:**

6 **“(A) Self-directed, injurious behavior with an intent to die as a re-**  
7 **sult of the behavior;**

8 **“(B) Nonfatal, self-directed, potentially injurious behavior with an**  
9 **intent to die as a result of the behavior that may not result in injury;**  
10 **or**

11 **“(C) Thinking about, considering or planning suicide.**

12 **“(b) ‘Violence’ means aggressive behavior with the intention, or an**  
13 **outcome that poses a risk, of serious or lethal injury.**

14 **“(2) The Department of Education shall establish the School Safety**  
15 **Multidisciplinary Assessment Team System. The system shall consist**  
16 **of state-supported regional school safety multidisciplinary assessment**  
17 **teams to support school personnel in addressing situations concerning**  
18 **students:**

19 **“(a) Engaged in violence;**

20 **“(b) Posing a threat of violence to others; or**

21 **“(c) Exhibiting suicidal behavior.**

1       **“(3) The state-supported, regional teams shall:**  
2       **“(a) Offer training to school district employees and community**  
3 **partners of school districts;**  
4       **“(b) Support school districts in the establishment of school-based**  
5 **school safety multidisciplinary assessment teams;**  
6       **“(c) Support school districts and communities in the establishment**  
7 **of local school safety multidisciplinary assessment teams; and**  
8       **“(d) Provide ongoing consultation, training and technical assistance**  
9 **to school and local school safety multidisciplinary assessment teams**  
10 **to:**  
11       **“(A) Investigate potential danger and identify circumstances and**  
12 **risk factors that may increase risk for potential violence or suicidal**  
13 **behavior;**  
14       **“(B) Develop management and intervention plans in collaboration**  
15 **with community partners; and**  
16       **“(C) Connect students and families to supportive resources.**  
17       **“(4) The State Board of Education, in collaboration with the Oregon**  
18 **Health Authority and other interested stakeholders, shall adopt rules**  
19 **related to the system established under this section.**  
20       **“SECTION 2.** Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, as amended by  
21 section 6, chapter 74, Oregon Laws 2016, is amended to read:  
22       **“Sec. 1.** (1) The Task Force on School Safety is established, consisting  
23 of [16] 17 members as follows:  
24       “(a) The Superintendent of State Police or the superintendent’s designee.  
25       “(b) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and  
26 Training or the director’s designee.  
27       “(c) The Governor’s Public Safety Policy Advisor.  
28       “(d) The Governor’s Education Policy Advisor.  
29       “(e) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among  
30 members of the Senate.

1 “(f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one mem-  
2 ber from among members of the House of Representatives.

3 “(g) The Governor shall appoint [10] **11** members as follows:

4 “(A) A member of the Oregon State Sheriffs’ Association;

5 “(B) A member of the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police;

6 “(C) A member of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;

7 “(D) A member of the Oregon Education Association;

8 “(E) A member of the Oregon School Employees Association;

9 “(F) A member of the Oregon School Boards Association;

10 “(G) A member of the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts;

11 “(H) A member of the Confederation of Oregon School Administrators;

12 “(I) A member representing the Department of Education; [and]

13 “(J) A member of the Association of Oregon Community Mental Health  
14 Programs[.]; **and**

15 **“(K) A member representing the Oregon Health Authority, with a**  
16 **specialty in suicide intervention and prevention.**

17 “(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are  
18 nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity  
19 only.

20 “(3) The task force shall:

21 “(a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department  
22 of State Police for hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all  
23 schools within the state, accessible to authorized users via the Internet; and

24 “(B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the  
25 development of administrative rules governing the database, including but  
26 not limited to:

27 “(i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the da-  
28 tabase;

29 “(ii) Identifying the persons or agencies that will maintain the database;

30 and

1 “(iii) Regulating the manner in which database records are added or  
2 modified;

3 “(b) Examine models of existing education and training programs for law  
4 enforcement officials, other first responders and school employees in the area  
5 of school safety and incident response; and

6 “(c) Examine models for existing protocols for school safety and incident  
7 response and consider whether standardized statewide school safety and in-  
8 cident response protocols would be appropriate.

9 “(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a  
10 quorum for the transaction of business.

11 “(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority  
12 of the voting members of the task force.

13 “(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson  
14 and one of its members to serve as vice chairperson.

15 “(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall  
16 make an appointment to become immediately effective.

17 “(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call  
18 of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

19 “(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the  
20 task force.

21 “(10) The task force shall submit a report concerning the floor plan da-  
22 tabase in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommen-  
23 dations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly  
24 related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than September 1, [2014.]  
25 **2017. A second report shall be submitted in a similar manner no later**  
26 **than September 1, 2019.**

27 “(11) The Department of State Police shall provide staff support to the  
28 task force.

29 “(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative  
30 Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual

1 and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance  
2 of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS  
3 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task  
4 force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of State  
5 Police for purposes of the task force.

6 “(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are di-  
7 rected to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the  
8 extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such infor-  
9 mation and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to  
10 perform their duties.”.

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
