PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 1057

On page 15 of the printed bill, after line 39, insert: 1 2 **"TASK FORCE ON CONSOLIDATION** 3 4 "SECTION 36c. (1) The Task Force on the Consolidation of Regula-5 tory Marijuana Programs is established. 6 "(2) The task force consists of 16 members appointed as follows: 7 "(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two nonvoting 8 members from among members of the Senate, one from among the 9 members of the Senate who belong to the majority party and one from 10 among the members of the Senate who belong to the minority party. 11 "(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two 12 nonvoting members from among members of the House of Represen-13 tatives, one from among the members of the House of Representatives 14 who belong to the majority party and one from among the members 15 of the House of Representatives who belong to the minority party. 16 "(c) The Governor shall appoint: 17 "(A) One person from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission; 18 "(B) One person from the Oregon Health Authority; 19 "(C) One person from the State Department of Agriculture; 20"(D) One person from the Department of Revenue; 21

1 "(E) One person from the Attorney General's office;

"(F) Two persons who represent or who are licensees under ORS
475B.010 to 475B.395;

4 "(G) Two persons who represent or who are registrants under ORS
5 475B.400 to 475B.525, one of whom must be a member of the Advisory
6 Committee on Medial Marijuana;

7 "(H) One person who represents laboratories registered under ORS
8 475B.565;

9 "(I) One person who is a consumer of marijuana items and who is
10 not registered under ORS 475B.415;

11 "(J) One person who is registered under ORS 475B.415.

"(3) The task force shall study the goals and potential effects of 12consolidating the programs regulating marijuana and marijuana-13 derived products under ORS 475B.010 and 475B.395, including potential 14 price changes, the rights and privileges of persons registered under 15ORS 475B.415, allowable grow canopy sizes and plant limits for 16 licensees under ORS 475B.010 to 475B.395 and registrants under ORS 17 475B.400 to 475B.525 and the sustainability of the program regulated 18 under ORS 475B.400 to 475B.525. 19

"(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes
 a quorum for the transaction of business.

"(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a
 majority of the voting members of the task force.

24 "(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as
 25 chairperson.

"(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force, provided that the task force meets at least six times before 1 December 1, 2017.

"(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of
the task force.

"(10) The task force shall submit a report and may include recommendations for administrative action to the Governor, the Oregon Liquor Control Commission and the Oregon Health Authority no later
than December 31, 2017.

"(11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided
by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to
an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to business
no later than December 31, 2017.

(12) The Legislative Policy and Research Director may employ 12persons necessary for the performance of the functions of the task 13 force. The Legislative Policy and Research Director shall fix the duties 14 and amounts of compensation of these employees. The task force shall 15 use the services of continuing legislative staff, without employing ad-16 ditional persons, to the greatest extent practicable. The Legislative 17 Counsel shall prepare drafts of legislative concepts for the task force 18 upon request. 19

"(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task
force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity only.

"(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement
 for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

"(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task force's duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

1	" <u>SECTION 36d.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law:
2	"(1) The Oregon Health Authority may not impose a fee on or col-
3	lect a fee from a marijuana grow site, as defined in ORS 475B.410,
4	pursuant to any provision of ORS 475B.400 to 475B.525, until December
5	31, 2017; and
6	"(2) The system developed and maintained under ORS 475B.150 may
7	not be used to track any marijuana or marijuana-derived product
8	regulated under the provisions of ORS 475B.010 to 475B.395 until June
9	31, 2018. ".
