8 **research on occupational illness and disease.**

9 **“SECTION 6. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate**
10 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
11 **declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect July 1, 2017.”.**

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
