- "(g) Did not have a good record of compliance with the alcoholic liquor laws of this state and the rules of the commission when previously licensed.
- "(h) Is not the legitimate owner of the business proposed to be licensed, or other persons have ownership interests in the business which have not been disclosed.
 - "(i) Is not possessed of or has not demonstrated financial responsibility sufficient to adequately meet the requirements of the business proposed to be licensed.
 - "(j) Is unable to read or write the English language or to understand the laws of Oregon relating to alcoholic liquor or the rules of the commission.
 - "(5) That there is a history of serious and persistent problems involving disturbances, lewd or unlawful activities or noise either in the premises proposed to be licensed or involving patrons of the establishment in the immediate vicinity of the premises if the activities in the immediate vicinity of the premises are related to the sale or service of alcohol under the exercise of the license privilege. Behavior which is grounds for refusal of a license under this section, where so related to the sale or service of alcohol, includes, but is not limited to obtrusive or excessive noise, music or sound vibrations; public drunkenness; fights; altercations; harassment; unlawful drug sales; alcohol or related litter; trespassing on private property; and public urination. Histories from premises currently or previously operated by the applicant may be considered when reasonable inference may be made that similar activities will occur as to the premises proposed to be licensed. The applicant may overcome the history by showing that the problems are

- 1 not serious or persistent or that the applicant demonstrates a willingness
- 2 and ability to control adequately the premises proposed to be licensed and
- 3 patrons' behavior in the immediate vicinity of the premises which is related
- 4 to the licensee's sale or service of alcohol under the licensee's exercise of the
- 5 license privilege.
- **"SECTION 9.** ORS 471.315 is amended to read:
- ⁷ "471.315. (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission may cancel, [or]
- 8 suspend, restrict or require mandatory training for any license issued
- 9 under this chapter, or impose a civil penalty in lieu of or in addition to a
- suspension as provided by ORS 471.322, if the commission finds or has rea-
- sonable ground to believe any of the following to be true:
- "(a) That the licensee:
- "(A) Has violated any provision of this chapter or ORS 474.115 or any rule
- of the commission adopted pursuant thereto.
- 15 "(B) Has made any false representation or statement to the commission
- in order to induce or prevent action by the commission.
- 17 "(C) Is not maintaining an acceptable bond as required by ORS 471.311
- or is not maintaining the insurance or bond required by ORS 471.168.

- 24 "(G) Has knowingly sold alcoholic liquor to persons under 21 years of age 25 or to persons visibly intoxicated at the time of sale.
- 26 "(H) Has allowed the consumption of alcoholic liquor on the licensed 27 premises by a person who is visibly intoxicated at the time of consumption.
- 28 "(I) Has misrepresented to a customer or the public any alcoholic liquor 29 sold by the licensee.
- 30 "(J) Since the granting of the license, has been convicted of a felony, of

- violating any of the liquor laws of this state, general or local, or of any misdemeanor or violation of any municipal ordinance committed on the licensed premises.
- "(b) That any person licensed to sell at retail for consumption on the premises is acting as an agent of, or is a manufacturer or wholesaler of alcoholic liquors, or has borrowed money or property, or has accepted gratuities or rebates, or has obtained the use of equipment from any manufacturer or wholesaler of alcoholic liquor or any agent thereof.
- "(c) That there is a history of serious and persistent problems involving 9 disturbances, lewd or unlawful activities or noise either in the premises or 10 involving patrons of the establishment in the immediate vicinity of the 11 premises if the activities in the immediate vicinity of the premises are re-12 lated to the sale or service of alcohol under the exercise of the license 13 privilege. Behavior that is grounds for cancellation or suspension of a license 14 under this section, where so related to the sale or service of alcohol, includes 15 but is not limited to obtrusive or excessive noise, music or sound vibrations; 16 public drunkenness; fights; altercations; harassment or unlawful drug sales; 17 alcohol or related litter; trespassing on private property; and public 18 urination. Mitigating factors include a showing by the licensee that the 19 problems are not serious or persistent or that the licensee has demonstrated 20 a willingness and ability to control adequately the licensed premises and 21 patrons' behavior in the immediate vicinity of the premises which is related 22 to the licensee's sale or service of alcohol under the licensee's exercise of the 23 license privilege. 24
- "(d) That there is any other reason that, in the opinion of the commission, based on public convenience or necessity, warrants canceling or suspending such license.
