**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS TO
A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 20**

1 On page 17 of the printed A-engrossed bill, delete lines 23 through 45.

2 On page 18, delete lines 1 through 18 and insert:

3 **“SECTION 15.** ORS 807.066, as amended by section 30, chapter 66, Oregon
4 Laws 2017 (Enrolled House Bill 2314), is amended to read:

5 “807.066. (1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, the Department of
6 Transportation may not issue driving privileges to a person who is under 18
7 years of age unless:

8 “(a) The person has graduated from high school and provides the depart-
9 ment with proof of graduation satisfactory to the department;

10 “(b) The person has received a certificate for passing an approved high
11 school equivalency test, such as the General Educational Development (GED)
12 test, from a community college and provides the department with proof of the
13 certificate satisfactory to the department; or

14 “(c) The person’s parent or legal guardian certifies that the person is:

15 “(A) Enrolled in a school of this state, or any other state or any other
16 country;

17 “(B) Enrolled in a community college and making satisfactory progress
18 toward a certificate for passing an approved high school equivalency test,
19 such as the General Educational Development (GED) test, [*or*] a high school
20 diploma **or a modified diploma**;

21 “(C) Being taught by a private teacher, legal guardian or parent in com-

1 pliance with ORS 339.035;

2 “(D) Exempted from school attendance requirements due to circumstances
3 beyond the control of the person; or

4 “(E) Exempt under ORS 339.030 (2) from the requirement to attend school.

5 “(2) The department may not issue driving privileges to a person who is
6 under 18 years of age and whose driving privileges are suspended under ORS
7 809.423 (3) for withdrawing from school unless the person:

8 “(a) Has graduated from high school and provides the department with
9 proof of graduation satisfactory to the department;

10 “(b) Has received a certificate for passing an approved high school
11 equivalency test, such as the General Educational Development (GED) test,
12 from a community college and provides the department with proof of the
13 certificate satisfactory to the department;

14 “(c) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and
15 signed by the principal, or the designee of the principal, of the school at-
16 tended by the person that declares that the person is enrolled in a school
17 of this state, or any other state or any other country;

18 “(d) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and
19 signed by the authorized representative of the community college attended
20 by the person that declares that the person is making satisfactory progress
21 toward a certificate for passing an approved high school equivalency test
22 such as the General Educational Development (GED) test;

23 “(e) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and
24 signed by the authorized representative of the community college attended
25 by the person that declares that the person is making satisfactory progress
26 toward a high school diploma **or a modified diploma**;

27 “(f) Provides the department with a form provided by the department and
28 signed by the authorized representative of the education service district or
29 school district having jurisdiction over the area of the person’s residence
30 that declares that the person is being taught by a private teacher, legal

1 guardian or parent in compliance with ORS 339.035;

2 “(g) Provides the department with documentation satisfactory to the de-
3 partment that indicates that the person is exempted from school attendance
4 requirements due to circumstances beyond the control of the person; or

5 “(h) Provides the department with documentation satisfactory to the de-
6 partment that the person is exempt under ORS 339.030 (2) from the require-
7 ment to attend school.”.

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
