6 **for issuance of certificates of participation and other financing agree-**  
7 **ments of the state during the 2017-2019 biennium for the Oregon De-**  
8 **partment of Administrative Services is \$110,985,000.**

9 **“SECTION 4. The amounts allocated for private activity bonds, as**  
10 **provided in ORS 286A.615, are as follows:**

9 (3) If an increase in this state’s population, a  
10 sufficient increase in the region’s Consumer  
11 Price Index or a change in federal law allows  
12 the private activity bond limit as set by the  
13 Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, to  
14 exceed \$409,346,500 during the 2018 calendar  
15 year or \$409,346,500 during the 2019 calendar  
16 year, the increase is allocated to the Private  
17 Activity Bond Committee.

18 **“SECTION 5. (1) For purposes of Article XI-F(1), section 1, of the**  
19 **Oregon Constitution, the Legislative Assembly determines that the**  
20 **projects authorized to be financed pursuant to section 1 (8) of this 2017**  
21 **Act with bonds issued under Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon Constitution**  
22 **will benefit higher education institutions or activities.**

23 **“(2) For purposes of Article XI-G, section 1, of the Oregon Consti-**  
24 **tution, the Legislative Assembly determines that the projects author-**  
25 **ized to be financed pursuant to section 1 (1) of this 2017 Act with bonds**  
26 **issued under Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution will benefit**  
27 **higher education institutions or activities or community colleges au-**  
28 **thorized by law to receive state aid.**

29 **“SECTION 6. Bonds authorized under section 1 (1) of this 2017 Act**  
30 **may not be issued until the constructing authority certifies that the**

1 **constructing authority has matching funds available for the same or**  
2 **similar purposes as the Article XI-G bonds that will fund the grant to**  
3 **the constructing authority, that the match funds are not proceeds of**  
4 **indebtedness incurred by the state under any other article of the**  
5 **Oregon Constitution, and that the match funds are available to the**  
6 **constructing authority in an amount at least equal to the amount of**  
7 **indebtedness incurred by the state through the issuance of the Article**  
8 **XI-G bonds.**

9 **“SECTION 7.** ORS 286A.833 is amended to read:

10 “286A.833. (1) In accordance with the applicable provisions of this chap-  
11 ter, the State Treasurer, with the concurrence of the [*Director of the Oregon*  
12 *Department of Administrative Services*] **Higher Education Coordinating**  
13 **Commission**, may issue Article XI-F(1) bonds **for the benefit of a public**  
14 **university** if:

15 “(a) The [*Higher Education Coordinating Commission*] **Director of the**  
16 **Oregon Department of Administrative Services** requests that bonds be  
17 issued for the purposes specified in Article XI-F(1) of the Oregon Constitu-  
18 tion, plus an amount determined by the State Treasurer to pay estimated  
19 bond-related costs;

20 “(b) The issuance does not exceed the budget authorization for bond is-  
21 suance established under ORS 286A.035; and

22 “(c) A loan agreement is executed under ORS 286A.836 prior to sale of the  
23 bonds.

24 “(2) The State Treasurer may issue Article XI-F(1) bonds for the purpose  
25 of refunding Article XI-F(1) bonds, with the concurrence of a public univer-  
26 sity that received proceeds of Article XI-F(1) bonds to be refunded.

27 “(3) The State Treasurer shall deposit the net proceeds of Article XI-F(1)  
28 bonds in one or more project funds established in the State Treasury or with  
29 a third party under contract with the Oregon Department of Administrative  
30 Services and approved by the State Treasurer. Net proceeds of Article XI-F(1)

1 bonds must be expended for the purposes described in the commission's  
2 budget authorization.

3 “(4) If at any time the department and the commission jointly determine  
4 that the net proceeds of Article XI-F(1) bonds deposited in a project fund  
5 pursuant to subsection (3) of this section exceed the cost of the project de-  
6 scribed in the commission's budget authorization, the department may allo-  
7 cate and transfer the excess amount as determined by the department to  
8 other project funds, the Article XI-F(1) Bond Fund established under ORS  
9 286A.839 or the Article XI-F(1) Bond Administration Fund established under  
10 ORS 286A.842. Before transferring an excess amount under this subsection,  
11 the department shall consult with the public university for whose benefit the  
12 Article XI-F(1) bonds were issued, but the department may transfer an excess  
13 amount without the approval of the public university. Excess amounts may  
14 not be transferred to a project fund for the project of another public uni-  
15 versity unless the applicable loan agreements and loan repayment schedules  
16 are amended to reflect the transfer.

17 “(5) Article XI-F(1) bonds are direct general obligations of the State of  
18 Oregon and must contain a direct promise on behalf of the State of Oregon  
19 to pay the principal of, the interest on and the premium, if any, on the Ar-  
20 ticle XI-F(1) bonds. The State of Oregon shall pledge its full faith and credit  
21 and taxing power to the payment of the principal of, the interest on and the  
22 premium, if any, on Article XI-F(1) bonds, and the ad valorem taxing power  
23 of the State of Oregon may be pledged to pay Article XI-F(1) bonds.

24 **“SECTION 8.** ORS 283.085 is amended to read:

25 “283.085. As used in ORS 283.085 to 283.092:

26 “(1) ‘Available funds’ means funds appropriated or otherwise made avail-  
27 able by the Legislative Assembly to pay amounts due under a financing  
28 agreement for the fiscal period in which the payments are due, unexpended  
29 proceeds of the financing agreement and reserves or other amounts that have  
30 been deposited in trust to pay amounts due under the financing agreement.

1       “(2) ‘Credit enhancement agreement’ means any agreement or contractual  
2 relationship between the state and any bank, trust company, insurance com-  
3 pany, surety bonding company, pension fund or other financial institution  
4 providing additional credit on or security for a financing agreement or cer-  
5 tificates of participation authorized by ORS 283.085 to 283.092.

6       “(3) ‘Financing agreement’ means a lease purchase agreement, an install-  
7 ment sale agreement, a loan agreement or any other agreement:

8       “(a) To finance real or personal property that is or will be owned and  
9 operated by the state or any of its agencies;

10       “(b) To finance infrastructure, including but not limited to telecommuni-  
11 cations systems, systems for water, sewage, electricity, steam or natural gas  
12 and other equipment or improvements that are necessary or appropriate to  
13 support a facility that is, or will be, owned or operated by the state;

14       “(c) To finance infrastructure components that are, or will be, owned or  
15 operated by a local government agency of this state if the Director of the  
16 Oregon Department of Administrative Services determines that financing the  
17 infrastructure facilitates the construction or operation of an adult or juve-  
18 nile corrections facility or a public safety training facility owned or operated  
19 by the state or any of its agencies;

20       “(d) To finance all or a portion of the state’s pension liabilities for re-  
21 tirement, health care or disability benefits, in an amount that produces net  
22 proceeds that do not exceed the State Treasurer’s estimate of those liabilities  
23 based on information provided to the State Treasurer by the Public Em-  
24 ployees Retirement System; [*or*]

25       “(e) **To finance:**

26       “(A) **The release of all or a portion of the Elliott State Forest from**  
27 **restrictions resulting from ownership of that forest by the Common**  
28 **School Fund; or**

29       “(B) **Compensation paid to the Common School Fund for the pres-**  
30 **ervation of noneconomic benefits of the forest through the imposition,**

1 **transfer or sale of restrictions such as easements, use requirements**  
2 **or other methods that preserve noneconomic benefits of the forest for**  
3 **the public, including recreation, aesthetics, wildlife or habitat preser-**  
4 **vation or other environmental and quality of life considerations; or**

5 “[e)] (f) To refinance previously executed financing agreements.

6 “(4) ‘Financing costs’ means costs or expenses that the director deter-  
7 mines are necessary or desirable in connection with entering into financing  
8 agreements and maintaining the certificate of participation program, includ-  
9 ing but not limited to payment of:

10 “(a) Amounts due under financing agreements;

11 “(b) Costs and obligations the director or any other agency of the state  
12 incurs in connection with the exercise of a power granted by ORS 283.085  
13 to 283.092; and

14 “(c) Amounts due in connection with the investment of proceeds of fi-  
15 nancing agreements.

16 “(5) ‘Personal property’ means tangible personal property, software and  
17 fixtures.

18 “(6) ‘Property rights’ means, with respect to personal property, the rights  
19 of a secured party under ORS chapter 79, and, with respect to real property,  
20 the rights of a trustee or lender under a lease authorized by ORS 283.089  
21 (1)(e).

22 “(7) ‘Software’ means software and training and maintenance contracts  
23 related to the operation of computing equipment.

24 **“SECTION 9. (1) A community college for which one project to be**  
25 **funded with general obligation bonds authorized to be issued under**  
26 **Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution is approved in this 2017 Act**  
27 **may not request approval of an additional project to be funded with**  
28 **general obligation bonds authorized to be issued under Article XI-G**  
29 **of the Oregon Constitution until the beginning of the regular session**  
30 **of the Legislative Assembly held in 2021, unless the community college**

1 **withdraws the project approved under this 2017 Act.**

2 **“(2) A community college for which two projects to be funded with**  
3 **general obligation bonds authorized to be issued under Article XI-G**  
4 **of the Oregon Constitution is approved in this 2017 Act may not re-**  
5 **quest approval of an additional project to be funded with general ob-**  
6 **ligation bonds authorized to be issued under Article XI-G of the**  
7 **Oregon Constitution until the beginning of the regular session of the**  
8 **Legislative Assembly held in 2025, unless the community college with-**  
9 **draws a project approved under this 2017 Act.**

10 **“SECTION 10. (1) Out of the amount specified in section 1 (6)(j)(A)**  
11 **of this 2017 Act, the State Treasurer may issue Article XI-Q bonds in**  
12 **an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 of net proceeds for the purposes**  
13 **and in the manner specified in section 8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws**  
14 **2013, plus an amount estimated by the State Treasurer to pay esti-**  
15 **imated bond-related costs.**

16 **“(2) Out of the amount specified in section 1 (6)(j)(B) of this 2017**  
17 **Act, the State Treasurer may issue Article XI-Q bonds in an amount**  
18 **not to exceed \$92,600,000 of net proceeds for the purposes and in the**  
19 **manner specified in section 8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013, plus an**  
20 **amount estimated by the State Treasurer to pay estimated bond-**  
21 **related costs.**

22 **“(3) For purposes of sections 8 and 9, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013,**  
23 **and section 64, chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2013, bonds issued pursuant**  
24 **to this section are considered to be bonds issued pursuant to section**  
25 **8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013.**

26 **“(4) Bonds may not be issued out of the amounts specified in section**  
27 **1 (6)(j)(A) and (B) of this 2017 Act except as provided in this section.**

28 **“SECTION 11. (1) As used in this section:**

29 **“(a) ‘Apprentice’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 660.010.**

30 **“(b) ‘Apprenticeable occupation’ has the meaning given that term**

1 in ORS 660.010.

2 “(c) ‘Apprenticeship training program’ means the total system of  
3 apprenticeship that a particular local joint committee, as defined in  
4 ORS 660.010, operates, including the local joint committee’s registered  
5 standards and all other terms and conditions for qualifying, recruiting,  
6 selecting, employing and training apprentices in an apprenticeable  
7 occupation.

8 “(d) ‘Minority individual’ has the meaning given that term in ORS  
9 200.005.

10 “(e) ‘Qualified contracts’ means contracts that:

11 “(A) Are for improvements to real property in connection with the  
12 University of Oregon Campus for Accelerating Scientific Impact;

13 “(B) Have a cost that, at the time the contract is executed, is esti-  
14 mated to be greater than \$200,000; and

15 “(C) Are to be paid from proceeds of bonds issued under Article  
16 XI-G of the Oregon Constitution.

17 “(f) ‘Woman’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 200.005.

18 “(2) The University of Oregon, in all qualified contracts, shall re-  
19 quire contractors to:

20 “(a) Employ apprentices to perform 15 percent of the work hours  
21 that workers in apprenticeable occupations perform under the con-  
22 tract, in a manner consistent with the apprentices’ respective ap-  
23 prenticeship training programs;

24 “(b) Establish and execute a plan for outreach, recruitment and  
25 retention of women and minority individuals to perform work under  
26 the contract; and

27 “(c) Require any subcontractors engaged by the contractors to abide  
28 by the requirements set forth in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this sub-  
29 section.

30 “(3) On or before February 1 of each year, the University of Oregon



1 shall report to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means or Joint In-  
2 terim Committee on Ways and Means on the amount of work per-  
3 formed by apprentices, women and minority individuals under  
4 qualified contracts.

5 “SECTION 12. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate  
6 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is  
7 declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect July 1, 2017.”.

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
