**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO  
HOUSE BILL 2660**

1 Delete lines 4 through 19 of the printed corrected bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall make written**  
3 **materials available on the authority’s website to educate breast cancer**  
4 **patients about the availability of insurance coverage for breast recon-**  
5 **struction surgery and breast prostheses following a mastectomy. The**  
6 **authority shall update the materials at least annually.**

7 **“(2) The authority shall place a link to the educational materials**  
8 **described in subsection (1) of this section next to a link on the website**  
9 **to information about breast cancer screenings and under a tab desig-**  
10 **ated ‘Breast Reconstruction Education.’ The materials must include**  
11 **links to information about breast reconstruction surgery published by**  
12 **nonprofit organizations with expertise in breast reconstruction sur-**  
13 **gery, including but not limited to information about:**

14 **“(a) The availability of the option to have breast reconstruction**  
15 **surgery following a mastectomy including that the breast recon-**  
16 **struction surgery may be performed at the time of a mastectomy or**  
17 **may be delayed until a later date.**

18 **“(b) Prostheses or breast forms as alternatives to breast recon-**  
19 **struction surgery.**

20 **“(c) The requirements of the Women’s Health and Cancer Rights**  
21 **Act of 1998 (P.L. 105-277) including the right to breast reconstruction**

1 surgery following a mastectomy even if the surgery is delayed until a  
2 later date.

3 “(3) The authority shall include educational information about  
4 breast reconstruction surgery in newsletters or similar publications  
5 that the authority sends to clients or physicians on a weekly or  
6 monthly basis.

7 “SECTION 2. (1) The Department of Consumer and Business Ser-  
8 vices shall make written materials available on the department’s  
9 website to educate breast cancer patients about the availability of in-  
10 surance coverage for breast reconstruction surgery and breast  
11 prostheses following a mastectomy. The department shall update the  
12 materials at least annually.

13 “(2) The department shall place a link to the educational materials  
14 described in subsection (1) of this section close to links on the website  
15 to information for consumers about health insurance and under a tab  
16 designated ‘Breast Reconstruction Education.’ The materials must in-  
17 clude links to information about breast reconstruction surgery pub-  
18 lished by nonprofit organizations with expertise in breast  
19 reconstruction surgery, including but not limited to information  
20 about:

21 “(a) The availability of the option to have breast reconstruction  
22 surgery following a mastectomy including that the breast recon-  
23 struction surgery may be performed at the time of a mastectomy or  
24 may be delayed until a later date.

25 “(b) Prostheses or breast forms as alternatives to breast recon-  
26 struction surgery.

27 “(c) The requirements of the Women’s Health and Cancer Rights  
28 Act of 1998 (P.L. 105-277) including the right to breast reconstruction  
29 surgery following a mastectomy even if the surgery is delayed until a  
30 later date.

1       **“(3) The department shall include educational information about**  
2 **breast reconstruction surgery in newsletters or similar publications**  
3 **that the department sends to consumers or carriers on a weekly or**  
4 **monthly basis.”.**
