**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2661**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “676.992” and insert “124.050
2 and 646.608”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 31 and delete pages 2 and 3 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. As used in sections 1 to 3 of this 2017 Act:**

5 **“(1) ‘Client’ means an individual who seeks a long term care refer-**
6 **ral for the individual or for another individual.**

7 **“(2) ‘Facility’ means:**

8 **“(a) A long term care facility as defined in ORS 442.015.**

9 **“(b) A residential care facility as defined in ORS 443.400, including**
10 **but not limited to an assisted living facility and a facility marketed**
11 **as a memory care community.**

12 **“(c) An adult foster home as defined in ORS 443.705.**

13 **“(d) A continuing care retirement community as defined in ORS**
14 **101.020.**

15 **“(e) An in-home care agency as defined in ORS 443.305.**

16 **“(f) A home health agency as defined in ORS 443.014.**

17 **“(3) ‘Long term care referral’ means a referral to a facility in con-**
18 **nection with which the referral agent receives compensation from the**
19 **facility.**

20 **“(4) ‘Placement information’ means any information a person col-**
21 **lects from a client about the client or the subject of placement, in-**

1 cluding but not limited to name, email address, phone number, zip
2 code, medical history, information about necessary assistance for ac-
3 tivities of daily living or the reasons for seeking long term care.

4 “(5)(a) ‘Referral agent’ means a person that provides long term care
5 referrals.

6 “(b) ‘Referral agent’ does not include:

7 “(A) A facility or its employees.

8 “(B) A resident or patron of a facility who refers a client to a fa-
9 cility and receives a discount or other remuneration from the facility.

10 “(C) A public body as defined in ORS 174.109.

11 “(6) ‘Subject of placement’ means the individual to be placed with
12 a facility through a long term care referral.

13 **“SECTION 2. (1) Before providing a long term care referral, a re-
14 ferral agent shall provide the client with a clear, conspicuous written
15 disclosure designed to give actual notice to the client of its contents.**

16 **The disclosure must include:**

17 “(a) A description of the long term care referral to be provided by
18 the referral agent.

19 “(b) A statement of whether the referral agent provides a warranty
20 or another referral if a placement is unsatisfactory.

21 “(c) The referral agent’s contact information, including address and
22 phone number.

23 “(d) The referral agent’s privacy policy.

24 “(e) A statement of whether the referral agent provides referrals
25 only to facilities with which the agent has an existing contract.

26 “(f) A statement of whether the referral fees for the long term care
27 referral will be paid to the referral agent by the facility.

28 “(2) A referral agent may not:

29 “(a) Share or sell a client’s placement information to a facility or
30 marketing affiliate without obtaining affirmative consent from the

1 **client for each instance of sharing or selling the information.**

2 **“(b) Refer a client to a facility in which the referral agent has an**
3 **ownership interest.**

4 **“(c) Contact a client who has asked the referral agent to stop con-**
5 **tacting the client.**

6 **“(3) Upon request of the client, the referral agent shall arrange for**
7 **the removal of placement information sent to a facility and terminate**
8 **any agreement with the facility regarding the client and the placement**
9 **information.**

10 **“(4) If a referral agent maintains a website, the website must con-**
11 **tain a link to any state agency website listing complaints concerning**
12 **facilities. If the referral agent does not maintain a website, the refer-**
13 **ral agent shall notify clients in writing of the state agency website**
14 **addresses.**

15 **“(5) Violation of this section is an unlawful practice under ORS**
16 **646.608.**

17 **“SECTION 3. (1) A person may not provide a long term care referral**
18 **unless the person is certified by the Department of Human Services**
19 **under this section.**

20 **“(2) The department shall issue a certificate to provide long term**
21 **care referrals to an applicant who meets requirements and pays fees**
22 **established by the department by rule. The department shall require**
23 **an applicant to demonstrate that the applicant maintains at least \$1**
24 **million in general liability insurance.**

25 **“(3) The department may adopt rules as necessary to administer**
26 **sections 1 to 3 of this 2017 Act.**

27 **“(4) The department may impose a civil penalty on a person for vi-**
28 **olation of sections 1 to 3 of this 2017 Act or violation of rules adopted**
29 **under sections 1 to 3 of this 2017 Act.**

30 **“SECTION 4. ORS 124.050 is amended to read:**

1 “124.050. As used in ORS 124.050 to 124.095:

2 “(1) ‘Abuse’ means one or more of the following:

3 “(a) Any physical injury to an elderly person caused by other than acci-
4 dental means, or which appears to be at variance with the explanation given
5 of the injury.

6 “(b) Neglect.

7 “(c) Abandonment, including desertion or willful forsaking of an elderly
8 person or the withdrawal or neglect of duties and obligations owed an el-
9 derly person by a caretaker or other person.

10 “(d) Willful infliction of physical pain or injury upon an elderly person.

11 “(e) An act that constitutes a crime under ORS 163.375, 163.405, 163.411,
12 163.415, 163.425, 163.427, 163.465, 163.467 or 163.525.

13 “(f) Verbal abuse.

14 “(g) Financial exploitation.

15 “(h) Sexual abuse.

16 “(i) Involuntary seclusion of an elderly person for the convenience of a
17 caregiver or to discipline the person.

18 “(j) A wrongful use of a physical or chemical restraint of an elderly per-
19 son, excluding an act of restraint prescribed by a physician licensed under
20 ORS chapter 677 and any treatment activities that are consistent with an
21 approved treatment plan or in connection with a court order.

22 “(2) ‘Elderly person’ means any person 65 years of age or older who is not
23 subject to the provisions of ORS 441.640 to 441.665.

24 “(3) ‘Facility’ means:

25 “(a) A long term care facility as that term is defined in ORS 442.015.

26 “(b) A residential facility as that term is defined in ORS 443.400, includ-
27 ing but not limited to an assisted living facility.

28 “(c) An adult foster home as that term is defined in ORS 443.705.

29 “(4) ‘Financial exploitation’ means:

30 “(a) Wrongfully taking the assets, funds or property belonging to or in-

1 tended for the use of an elderly person or a person with a disability.

2 “(b) Alarming an elderly person or a person with a disability by convey-
3 ing a threat to wrongfully take or appropriate money or property of the
4 person if the person would reasonably believe that the threat conveyed would
5 be carried out.

6 “(c) Misappropriating, misusing or transferring without authorization any
7 money from any account held jointly or singly by an elderly person or a
8 person with a disability.

9 “(d) Failing to use the income or assets of an elderly person or a person
10 with a disability effectively for the support and maintenance of the person.

11 “(5) ‘Intimidation’ means compelling or deterring conduct by threat.

12 “(6) ‘Law enforcement agency’ means:

13 “(a) Any city or municipal police department.

14 “(b) Any county sheriff’s office.

15 “(c) The Oregon State Police.

16 “(d) Any district attorney.

17 “(e) A police department established by a university under ORS 352.121
18 or 353.125.

19 “(7) ‘Neglect’ means failure to provide basic care or services that are
20 necessary to maintain the health or safety of an elderly person.

21 “(8) ‘Person with a disability’ means a person described in:

22 “(a) ORS 410.040 (7); or

23 “(b) ORS 410.715.

24 “(9) ‘Public or private official’ means:

25 “(a) Physician or physician assistant licensed under ORS chapter 677,
26 naturopathic physician or chiropractor, including any intern or resident.

27 “(b) Licensed practical nurse, registered nurse, nurse practitioner, nurse’s
28 aide, home health aide or employee of an in-home health service.

29 “(c) Employee of the Department of Human Services or community de-
30 velopmental disabilities program.

1 “(d) Employee of the Oregon Health Authority, local health department
2 or community mental health program.

3 “(e) Peace officer.

4 “(f) Member of the clergy.

5 “(g) Regulated social worker.

6 “(h) Physical, speech or occupational therapist.

7 “(i) Senior center employee.

8 “(j) Information and referral or outreach worker.

9 “(k) Licensed professional counselor or licensed marriage and family
10 therapist.

11 “(L) Member of the Legislative Assembly.

12 “(m) Firefighter or emergency medical services provider.

13 “(n) Psychologist.

14 “(o) Provider of adult foster care or an employee of the provider.

15 “(p) Audiologist.

16 “(q) Speech-language pathologist.

17 “(r) Attorney.

18 “(s) Dentist.

19 “(t) Optometrist.

20 “(u) Chiropractor.

21 “(v) Personal support worker, as defined by rule adopted by the Home
22 Care Commission.

23 “(w) Home care worker, as defined in ORS 410.600.

24 “(x) **Referral agent, as defined in section 1 of this 2017 Act.**

25 “(10) ‘Services’ includes but is not limited to the provision of food,
26 clothing, medicine, housing, medical services, assistance with bathing or
27 personal hygiene or any other service essential to the well-being of an el-
28 derly person.

29 “(11)(a) ‘Sexual abuse’ means:

30 “(A) Sexual contact with an elderly person who does not consent or is

1 considered incapable of consenting to a sexual act under ORS 163.315;

2 “(B) Verbal or physical harassment of a sexual nature, including but not
3 limited to severe or pervasive exposure to sexually explicit material or lan-
4 guage;

5 “(C) Sexual exploitation;

6 “(D) Any sexual contact between an employee of a facility or paid
7 caregiver and an elderly person served by the facility or caregiver; or

8 “(E) Any sexual contact that is achieved through force, trickery, threat
9 or coercion.

10 “(b) ‘Sexual abuse’ does not mean consensual sexual contact between an
11 elderly person and:

12 “(A) An employee of a facility who is also the spouse of the elderly per-
13 son; or

14 “(B) A paid caregiver.

15 “(12) ‘Sexual contact’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 163.305.

16 “(13) ‘Verbal abuse’ means to threaten significant physical or emotional
17 harm to an elderly person or a person with a disability through the use of:

18 “(a) Derogatory or inappropriate names, insults, verbal assaults, profanity
19 or ridicule; or

20 “(b) Harassment, coercion, threats, intimidation, humiliation, mental cru-
21 elty or inappropriate sexual comments.

22 “**SECTION 5.** ORS 646.608 is amended to read:

23 “646.608. (1) A person engages in an unlawful practice if in the course of
24 the person’s business, vocation or occupation the person does any of the
25 following:

26 “(a) Passes off real estate, goods or services as the real estate, goods or
27 services of another.

28 “(b) Causes likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding as to the
29 source, sponsorship, approval, or certification of real estate, goods or ser-
30 vices.

1 “(c) Causes likelihood of confusion or of misunderstanding as to affil-
2 iation, connection, or association with, or certification by, another.

3 “(d) Uses deceptive representations or designations of geographic origin
4 in connection with real estate, goods or services.

5 “(e) Represents that real estate, goods or services have sponsorship, ap-
6 proval, characteristics, ingredients, uses, benefits, quantities or qualities that
7 the real estate, goods or services do not have or that a person has a spon-
8 sorship, approval, status, qualification, affiliation, or connection that the
9 person does not have.

10 “(f) Represents that real estate or goods are original or new if the real
11 estate or goods are deteriorated, altered, reconditioned, reclaimed, used or
12 secondhand.

13 “(g) Represents that real estate, goods or services are of a particular
14 standard, quality, or grade, or that real estate or goods are of a particular
15 style or model, if the real estate, goods or services are of another.

16 “(h) Disparages the real estate, goods, services, property or business of a
17 customer or another by false or misleading representations of fact.

18 “(i) Advertises real estate, goods or services with intent not to provide
19 the real estate, goods or services as advertised, or with intent not to supply
20 reasonably expectable public demand, unless the advertisement discloses a
21 limitation of quantity.

22 “(j) Makes false or misleading representations of fact concerning the
23 reasons for, existence of, or amounts of price reductions.

24 “(k) Makes false or misleading representations concerning credit avail-
25 ability or the nature of the transaction or obligation incurred.

26 “(L) Makes false or misleading representations relating to commissions
27 or other compensation to be paid in exchange for permitting real estate,
28 goods or services to be used for model or demonstration purposes or in ex-
29 change for submitting names of potential customers.

30 “(m) Performs service on or dismantles any goods or real estate if the

1 owner or apparent owner of the goods or real estate does not authorize the
2 service or dismantling.

3 “(n) Solicits potential customers by telephone or door to door as a seller
4 unless the person provides the information required under ORS 646.611.

5 “(o) In a sale, rental or other disposition of real estate, goods or services,
6 gives or offers to give a rebate or discount or otherwise pays or offers to pay
7 value to the customer in consideration of the customer giving to the person
8 the names of prospective purchasers, lessees, or borrowers, or otherwise
9 aiding the person in making a sale, lease, or loan to another person, if
10 earning the rebate, discount or other value is contingent upon an event oc-
11 ccurring after the time the customer enters into the transaction.

12 “(p) Makes any false or misleading statement about a prize, contest or
13 promotion used to publicize a product, business or service.

14 “(q) Promises to deliver real estate, goods or services within a certain
15 period of time with intent not to deliver the real estate, goods or services
16 as promised.

17 “(r) Organizes or induces or attempts to induce membership in a pyramid
18 club.

19 “(s) Makes false or misleading representations of fact concerning the of-
20 fering price of, or the person’s cost for real estate, goods or services.

21 “(t) Concurrent with tender or delivery of any real estate, goods or ser-
22 vices fails to disclose any known material defect or material nonconformity.

23 “(u) Engages in any other unfair or deceptive conduct in trade or com-
24 merce.

25 “(v) Violates any of the provisions relating to auction sales, consignment
26 sales, auctioneers, consignees or auction marts under ORS 698.640, whether
27 in a commercial or noncommercial situation.

28 “(w) Manufactures mercury fever thermometers.

29 “(x) Sells or supplies mercury fever thermometers unless the thermometer
30 is required by federal law, or is:

1 “(A) Prescribed by a person licensed under ORS chapter 677; and
2 “(B) Supplied with instructions on the careful handling of the
3 thermometer to avoid breakage and on the proper cleanup of mercury should
4 breakage occur.
5 “(y) Sells a thermostat that contains mercury unless the thermostat is
6 labeled in a manner to inform the purchaser that mercury is present in the
7 thermostat and that the thermostat may not be disposed of until the mercury
8 is removed, reused, recycled or otherwise managed to ensure that the mer-
9 cury does not become part of the solid waste stream or wastewater. For
10 purposes of this paragraph, ‘thermostat’ means a device commonly used to
11 sense and, through electrical communication with heating, cooling or venti-
12 lation equipment, control room temperature.
