PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2153

1 Delete lines 4 through 28 of the printed bill and insert:

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, 'interior design experience program' means an apprenticeship program meeting the content area requirements of a national accrediting association for interior design or interior architecture and completed under the supervision of the holder of a certificate from a nationally accredited institution, a certified commercial interior designer or a registered architect.

8 "(2) The Department of Consumer and Business Services shall es-9 tablish a voluntary certification program for commercial interior de-10 signers. The department shall adopt rules establishing the 11 qualifications necessary for certification. At a minimum, an applicant 12 for certification must qualify in one of the following ways:

"(a)(A) Hold a bachelor's degree in interior design or interior ar chitecture obtained by completing at least 120 semester hours or 180
 quarter hours of education or a master's degree in interior design or
 interior architecture;

"(B) Successfully complete an interior design experience program
 that includes at least 3,520 hours of experience; and

"(C) Pass an examination administered by a national accrediting
 association for interior design or interior architecture.

21 "(b)(A) Hold an associate's degree in interior design or interior ar-

chitecture obtained by completing at least 60 semester or 90 quarter
 hours of education;

"(B) Successfully complete an interior design experience program
that includes at least of 5,280 hours of experience; and

5 "(C) Pass an examination administered by a national accrediting 6 association for interior design or interior architecture.

"(c)(A) Have 10 years or more of full-time experience, or the
equivalent, that a national accrediting association for interior design
or interior architecture recognizes under an alternative review process
as equivalent to the education and experience described in paragraph
(b) of this subsection; and

"(B) Pass an examination administered by a national accrediting
 association for interior design or interior architecture.

14 "(3) To remain certified under this section, a commercial interior 15 designer must attend continuing education recognized by a national 16 accrediting association for interior design or interior architecture. The 17 designer must attend an average of at least 10 hours of continuing 18 education per year. The department shall establish the interval for 19 reporting continuing education.

"(4) An application for commercial interior designer certification
 must be in a form acceptable to the department.

"(5) The department may charge a fee for the filing of applications under subsection (4) of this section. The department shall adopt an amount for the fee that is reasonably calculated to compensate the department for expenses incurred in the administration and enforcement of the voluntary certification program.

"(6) Any work described in section 2 of this 2017 Act that a certified commercial interior designer performs is conclusively presumed to be commercial interior design work that is exempt from licensing or registration requirements under ORS 671.010 to 671.220 or 672.002 to 1 672.325 or ORS chapter 701.

"(7) This section and section 2 of this 2017 Act do not restrict the $\mathbf{2}$ scope of work that may otherwise be lawfully performed by a com-3 mercial interior designer, whether or not certified under this section. 4 "SECTION 2. (1) A commercial interior designer certified under $\mathbf{5}$ section 1 of this 2017 Act is qualified for purposes of any municipal 6 building inspection program under ORS 455.148 or 455.150, or a building 7 inspection program administered and enforced by the Department of 8 9 Consumer and Business Services, to submit plans, drawings, designs and specifications: 10

"(a) Regarding architecture or engineering work that the designer
 has prepared as an employee of a registered architect or registered
 professional engineer;

"(b) Drafted or otherwise prepared by the designer under the in struction, control or supervision of an employing registered architect
 or registered professional engineer;

17 "(c) For a single family residential building or a farm building;

"(d) For a garage, shed, shelter or other structure in connection
with or auxiliary to a single family residential building or a farm
building;

"(e) For the construction, alteration or enlargement of a building or an appurtenance to a building, if the building has a ground area of 4,000 square feet or less, and is not more than 20 feet in height from the top surface of lowest flooring to its highest interior overhead finish;

²⁶ "(f) For the alteration or repair of a building, if:

"(A) The structural part of the building, including but not limited
to the foundation walls, floors, roof, footings, bearing partitions,
beams, columns and joists, is not involved;

30 "(B) The building code classification for use or occupancy is not

1 changed; and

"(C) The building code classification by type of construction for the
building is not changed; and

4 "(g) For materials to be fabricated or consumed by a construction
5 contractor.

6 "(2) A certified commercial interior designer is qualified to super-7 vise the preparation of plans, drawings, designs and specifications de-8 scribed in subsection (1)(c) to (f) of this section, whether or not the 9 designer was the submitter of the plans, drawings, designs and spec-10 ifications for the work.

"(3) A municipality administering and enforcing a building in spection program under ORS 455.148 or 455.150 is not required to verify
 the certification of a commercial interior designer submitting plans,
 drawings, designs or specifications described in subsection (1) of this
 section to the municipality.".
