## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2664

1	On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2	rest of the line and delete line 3 and insert "and declaring an emergency.".
3	Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 through 17 and insert:
4	"SECTION 1. (1) The Legislative Policy and Research Director, in
5	collaboration with the Oregon Health Authority, shall develop recom-
6	mendations for legislation establishing an extended stay ambulatory
7	surgical center license in this state. The recommendations must be
8	developed using:
9	"(a) Data and evidence-based best practices;
10	"(b) A public process involving stakeholders representing the ge-
11	ographic diversity of this state and representing a broad range of in-
12	terests, including but not limited to:

- 13 "(A) Individuals representing ambulatory surgical centers;
- 14 "(B) Individuals representing hospitals;
- "(C) Physicians, nurses and other health care providers;
- 16 "(D) Individuals with expertise in patient safety; and
- 17 "(E) Consumer advocates.
- 18 "(2) The recommendations must include but are not limited to the 19 following:
- 20 "(a) An analysis of the need for extended stay ambulatory surgical 21 center licensees in this state and how the licensees would be expected

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- 2 "(A) Improve access to care by residents of this state;
- 3 "(B) Improve the quality of health care; and
- 4 "(C) Lower the cost of health care.
- 5 "(b) Standards to ensure patient safety, including but not limited 6 to:
- "(A) Agreements for the transfer of patients from licensees to hospitals or other health care providers, if appropriate;
- 9 "(B) Staffing standards, including standards for granting privileges, 10 conducting peer review and establishing adequate staffing levels; and
- "(C) Building code requirements and standards for facilities and equipment.
  - "(c) The structure of the authority's oversight of the licensees, including but not limited to:
    - "(A) The need for additional staff and funding for the authority;
- 16 "(B) The fee structure;
- 17 "(C) An appropriate certificate of need process;
- 18 "(D) Protocols and procedures to ensure that patient safety and 19 outcomes data are available to the public in aggregate form; and
- 20 "(E) Applications and eligibility for licenses.
- "(3) The Legislative Policy and Research Director shall compile the recommendations and report the recommendations to the Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2017.
- "SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2017 Act is repealed on December 31, 25 2017.
- "SECTION 3. This 2017 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2017 Act takes effect on its passage."

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
