## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2114

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, line 2, after "drugs" delete the rest of the 2 line and insert a period.

3 Delete lines 6 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:

"SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, 'board' means the Oregon 4 Medical Board, the Oregon State Board of Nursing, the Oregon Board  $\mathbf{5}$ of Dentistry and any other board that regulates practitioners who are 6 authorized under the laws of this state to prescribe opioids or opiates. 7 "(2) When issuing a prescription for an opioid or opiate to a patient 8 who is 18 years of age or older for outpatient use, a practitioner must 9 issue the prescription in accordance with any opioid and opiate pre-10 scribing guidelines adopted by the board that has regulatory jurisdic-11 tion over the practitioner by rule. 12

"(3) When issuing a prescription for an opioid or opiate to a patient
who is under 18 years of age, a practitioner must:

"(a) Issue the prescription in accordance with any opioid and opiate
 prescribing guidelines adopted by the board that has regulatory juris diction over the practitioner by rule; and

"(b) Discuss with the parent or legal guardian of the patient the
 risks associated with opioid or opiate use and the reason why the
 prescription is necessary.

21 "(4) Each board shall provide notice to the practitioners regulated

by the board who are authorized under the laws of this state to prescribe opioids or opiates of the requirements of subsections (2) and (3)
of this section.

4 "(5) Pursuant to ORS 431A.865 (2)(a)(G), a board may use pre-5 scription monitoring information related to the prescribing of opioids 6 and opiates when investigating the prescribing practices of a practi-7 tioner who is authorized under the laws of this state to prescribe 8 opioids or opiates.

"SECTION 3. When initially adopting the rules required by section 9 2 of this 2017 Act, the Oregon Medical Board, the Oregon State Board 10 of Nursing, the Oregon Board of Dentistry and any other board that 11 regulates practitioners who are authorized under the laws of this state 12to prescribe opioids or opiates must adopt rules that are in accordance 13 with the Oregon Opioid Prescribing Guidelines: Recommendations for 14 the Safe Use of Opioid Medications, as endorsed by the Oregon Medical 15Board in January 2017. 16

"SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2017 Act applies to the issuance of
 prescriptions occurring on or after the effective date of this 2017
 Act.".

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
