PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 497

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon insert "creating 2 new provisions; and".

3 On page 5, after line 1, insert:

"<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) If a person is arrested or issued a criminal citation
as a result of mistaken identity or another person using the identifying information of the person, and:

"(a) The person is not charged with a crime as a result of the arrest or citation, the law enforcement officer who arrested or cited the person shall file with the court a motion to set aside the record of the arrest or citation within one year of the arrest or issuance of the citation.

12 "(b) The charge against the person resulting from the arrest or ci-13 tation is dismissed, the prosecutor shall file with the court a motion 14 to set aside the record of the arrest or citation within one year of the 15 dismissal.

"(2)(a) Upon receipt of a motion under subsection (1) of this section,
 the court shall grant the motion and enter an order sealing the re cords of the arrest or citation.

"(b) The clerk of the court shall send a certified copy of the orderto:

21 "(A) The person's last known address;

"(B) The Department of Corrections if the person has been in the
custody of the department;

"(C) The Department of Transportation if the crime for which the
person was arrested or cited is a traffic crime as defined in ORS
801.545; and

6 "(D) Other agencies as directed by the court.

"(3) Upon entry of an order under subsection (2) of this section, the person who is the subject of the order is deemed not to have been arrested or cited, the arrest or issuance of a citation is deemed not to have occurred, and the person may answer accordingly any questions related to the occurrence of the arrest or citation.

"(4) As used in this section, 'mistaken identity' means the erroneous arrest or citation of a person for a crime as the result of misidentification by a witness or a law enforcement officer, confusion or mistake as to the identity of the person who committed the crime on the part of a witness or law enforcement officer, or misinformation provided to a law enforcement officer as to the identity of the person who committed the crime.".
