Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 4123
Permits duplicate health benefit plan coverage for public employees who begin employment before January 1, 2020.
- HB 4110
Allows Oregon Liquor Control Commission to issue temporary special events license to qualified marijuana processor, producer, retailer or wholesaler.

Work Session

- HB 4046
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Provides that outside compensation of employee of public university or community college is not included in employee's salary for purposes of Public Employees Retirement System.
- HB 4058
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Removes requirement that nonprofit corporation meet certain requirements for at least five years before filing application for issuance of labor contractor license.
- HB 4086
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Removes requirement that building inspector for municipality be employee of municipality.
- HB 4093
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Specifies that amateur athlete who plays for junior ice hockey team is not employee for purposes of certain employment-related provisions when amateur athlete is playing for team.
- HB 4112 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Directs Public Employees Retirement Board to initiate, resume or suspend payment of certain increased benefits under Public Employees Retirement System on first day of calendar quarter following receipt of notice by board that benefit payments are or are not subject to Oregon personal income tax. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 4113
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2013 AGENDA: Includes class size as mandatory subject of school district collective bargaining.

- HB 4115 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Prohibits statewide elected official, judge of Supreme Court or Court of Appeals or legislator from becoming member of Public Employees Retirement System on or after July 1, 2018, for purpose of service as statewide elected official, judge or legislator.
- HB 4127
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Permits contracting agency, in conducting procurement for architectural, engineering, photogrammetric mapping, transportation planning and land surveying services, to consider pricing policies, proposals and other pricing information along with prospective consultant's qualifications in specified circumstances.
- HB 4147
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Prohibits consumer reporting agencies from charging certain fees related to security freezes on consumer reports or protective records.
- HB 4154
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Makes contractor liable for unpaid wages, including other benefit payment or contribution, of employee of subcontractor at any tier.
- HB 4159
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 2/12/2018 AGENDA: Directs Public Employees Retirement Board to adopt rules providing that, if Oregon Investment Council invests assets of individual account program in multiple risk categories depending on characteristics of individual member, member of individual account program may direct investment of individual accounts in any risk category or with other assets of Public Employees Retirement Fund.
