HB 4067 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Expands definition of term "child with a disability" for purposes of special education to include children who have developmental delays and who are under 10 years of age. 4079 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

HB 4079 **

Requires Department of Human Services to disregard as resources moneys held in specified pension and retirement accounts in determining eligibility for temporary assistance for needy families.

HB 4081

Requires Department of Human Services to use savings in temporary assistance for needy families program to increase amount of cash grants.

Establishes Early Childhood Equity Innovation Fund.
