Respectfully, my husband and I join "72% of respondents to a BPRD survey that were **supportive** of completing a footbridge crossing on the south boundary of Bend, Oregon."*

House Bill 4029 seeks to ban bridge construction over the Deschutes River within certain portions of the Deschutes River Scenic Waterway, basically from the Central Oregon Irrigation District intake to a location upriver of Sunriver. This bill would effectively thwart the Bend Park and Recreation District's (BPRD) long-range plan to build a pedestrian bridge that would connect recreational trail users on the east side of the river with public lands and trails on the west side, which extend to Sunriver.
