I am a resident and registered voter in the City of Aurora Oregon. I have lived in this area since the early 1980s and am asking you to vote to not allow HB 4092 to bypass already well established land use laws and procedures.

This bill is designed specifically for Aurora Airport. It is an attempt by airport developers, and certain airport users, to by-pass the prescribed Oregon land use process, and avoid a public process, in order to covertly acquire additional property on Exclusive Farm Use (EFU) land south of and outside the current Airport fence prior to a possible FAA approval of a runway extension at Aurora.

<u>Please vote to have this project go through the prescribed Oregon land use process.</u> Just because a group of wealthy business people want something doesr mean they should be able to pay lawyers and lobbyist to change State laws to their whim (and profitability)
