My husband served on the Washington County Planning Commission for 8 years, and I have chaired the local neighborhood organization CPO 8. As well, my neighbors 40+ incorporated a 501 3C called the McKay Creek Valley Association to protect farm and forest land in Oregon, mainly in Washington County. We persevered for over 20 years, and with the help of 1,000 Friends of Oregon brought the 1st and 2nd state mandated ENFORCEMENT ORDERS on Washington County in the state. That is my background in land use.

I encourage a vote of NO on this zone change. The parcel has been farmed continually since the 1800's. It's prime land, among the best the world offers. The parcel could continue to support dry land, and irrigated farming.
