Dear Representative McLain:

The Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers (Alliance) is a trade association of 12 car and light truck manufacturers including BMW Group, FCA US LLC, Ford Motor Company, General Motors, Jaguar Land Rover, Mazda, Mercedes-Benz USA, Mitsubishi Motors, Porsche Cars North America, Toyota, Volkswagen Group of America, and Volvo Car USA.

The Alliance had multiple concerns about HB 4063 as filed and the earlier proposed amendments. However, we have only two comments about the Dash 3 amendment as follows:

- We respectfully request that the legislature delete “cybersecurity” on page 2, in line 16 of the bill. The NHTSA Guidance for Automated Driving Systems 2.0 released in September 2017 makes clear that vehicle design and vehicle cybersecurity is best left as a federal matter, not a state matter.
- In the task force’s work, it may become clear that some or all of the possible issues for its consideration are not appropriate for state legislation at this time. The record should be clear that making that kind of a recommendation is an appropriate outcome.
