My husband and I live on Quail Pine Loop, Bend, in a neighborhood indirectly impacted by the proposed bridge. We have been residents of Bend for 25 years.

## Please oppose HB 4029.

Bend voted for a bond in 2012 to fund and connect our heavily-used River Trail so that the whole community could have access to the recreational opportunities offered by that trail. Residents who live on the east side of the Deschutes River do not have fair and just access to the existing trail.

People who have not lived in our community for very long, or at all as full-time residents, feel that no bridge should go in. The fact that this legislation has been brought by these special-interest individuals goes against the spirit of Bend and the larger needs of the community, rather than the interests of the individual.
