There is nothing more fearful then watching your spouse with evil in their eyes sit over you and hold you in a way that stops your breathing, hope, and sense of self. It is a prison that you feel like you can never get out of. It is a prison that many feel like they cannot find the key to release them. We also know that strangulation increases the chances of the murder in domestic violence situation by over 750%. This is unacceptable and these victims are in a personal prison and held hostage by the grip of the law.

Today I'm calling you to action. I ask that you release the grip from the victim of strangulation give them the key to freedom by voting yes to SB 1652
