Measure Description:

Requires Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule program that places cap on greenhouse gas emissions and that provides market-based mechanism for covered entities to demonstrate compliance.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Energy and Environment to the House Committee on Rules.

The measure Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt a program that establishes a cap on total anthropogenic greenhouse gas emissions by covered entities and a market-based compliance mechanism.
