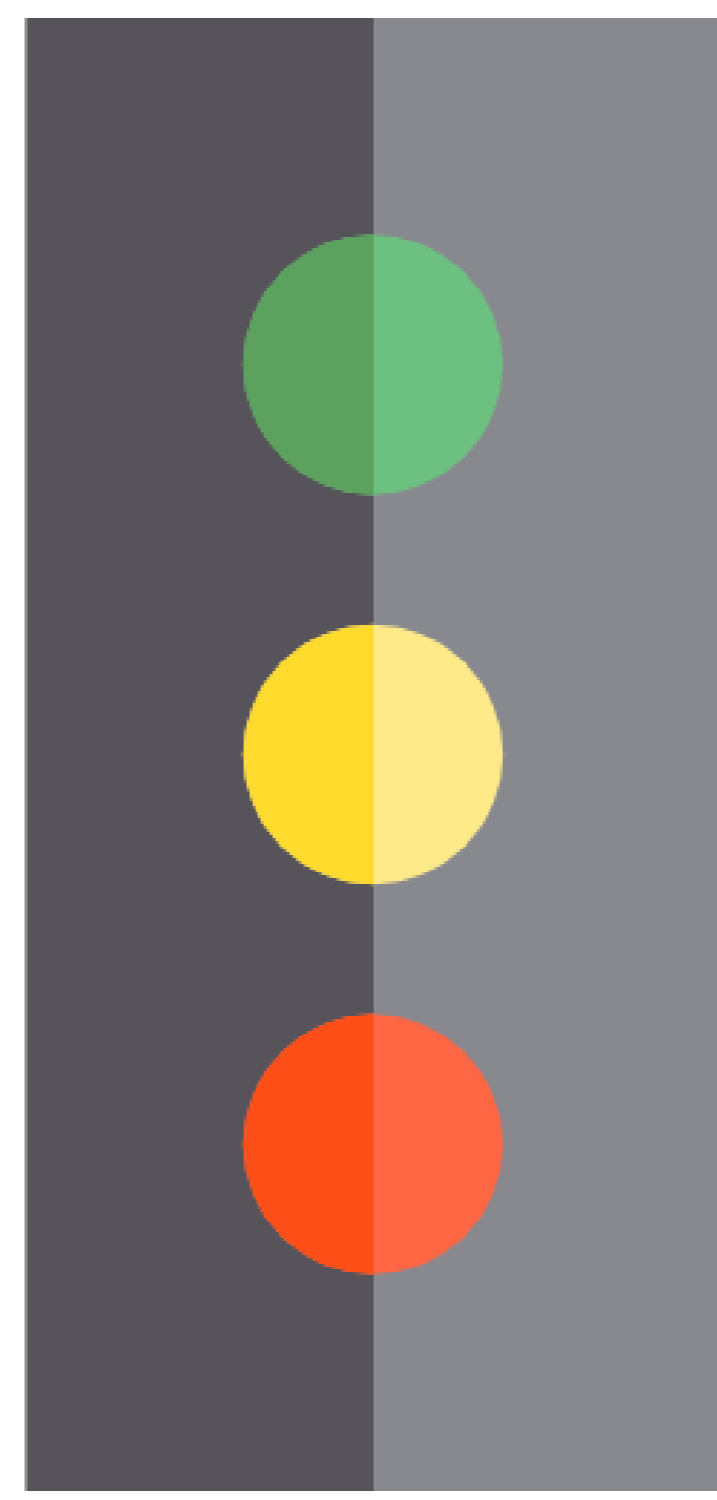
# WHAT is Stage-Gating?

defining stage-gating

*noun*

/stāj/ /gät/ 

1. formal review conducted at prescribed points in a **project life-cycle** for the purpose of controlling project risk, monitoring scope changes and maintaining stakeholder engagement
2. conceptual and operational **models** that provide key communication opportunities for moving a project from idea to closure (project to program)

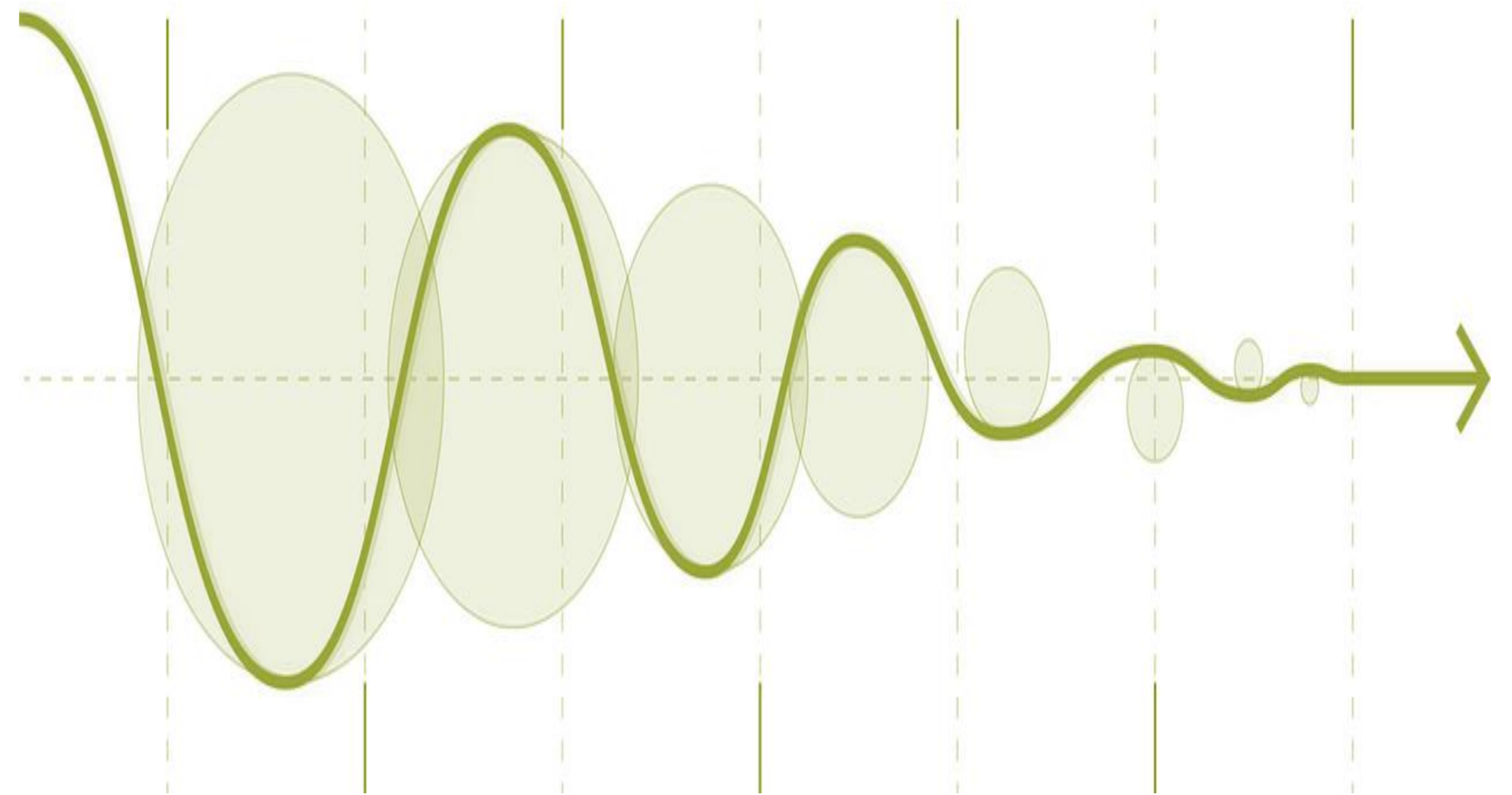


# WHY Stage-Gate?

the underlying rational

*“Progressive reduction of uncertainty” – G.M. Winch*

- ‘External’ review of the project
- Review project history to date (performance)
- Evaluate the project's near-term plans
- Validate commitment of resources
- Assess readiness for project to go forward



# Stage-Gate Evaluation

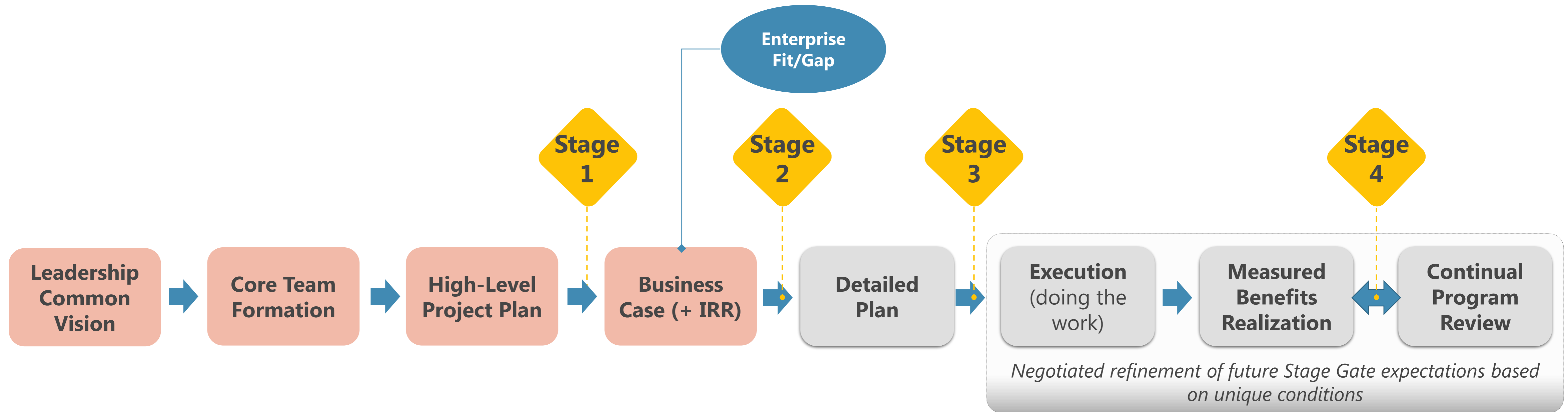
*factors* influencing Stage Gate *decisions*

- **Quality Parameters.** how well is a project being executed?
- **Operational Feasibility.** are there appropriate resources and can the project complete on time?
- **Economic Viability.** evaluation of Return On Investment (ROI) and Net Present Value (NPV)
