The sacrifice and commitment that was asked of those who served in uniform deserves to be reflected back with a similar degree of commitment in our public policymaking. If the obligation to protect our citizens' most basic welfare were treated with even half the passion and prestige that our military regularly receives at public

events, the question of generating revenue for housing assistance would hardly be a debate. It would simply be a matter of proper due diligence to make sure those who are facing increased economic and health risks are able to live with dignity in the richest nation on the planet.

We fully support the stated pledge that 25% of housing assistance program efforts funded via HB 4007 will be specifically allocated towards supporting veterans.
