Measure Description:

Increases the tax on cigarettes.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Revenue (DOR), Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), Department of Administrative Services (DAS), Oregon Judicial Department (OJD), Department of Human Services (DHS)

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Revenue to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

This measure increases the tax on cigarettes by 50% to 45 mills per cigarette. It also creates a new “floor tax” for entities that sell cigarettes and a new tax on inhalants. The new revenue would be distributed to the Department of Human Services for foster care services and to the Court Appointed Special Advocates program. The measure is anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Department of Revenue, the Oregon Health Authority, the Department of Administrative Services and the Department of Human Services.

This measure warrants a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of its budgetary impact. A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
