Recognizes and honors Paul Warner for his service.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- The life and service of Paul Warner
- Paul Warner's long tenure as the Legislative Revenue Officer
- The exceptional integrity exhibited by Paul Warner in his role

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

BACKGROUND:

Paul Warner has served Oregonians for 28 years, first as the Oregon State Economist and for the last 18 years as the Legislative Revenue Officer. He is the longest serving Legislative Revenue Officer in Oregon history.

Paul Warner was born in a military hospital in Germany and grew up in many places around the world, including Iceland, Mississippi and Tacoma, Washington, before he moved to Oregon in 1989. He has enjoyed more than 20 years of marriage with his wife Laurie Warner and together they have two grown children, Jill and Reed, and two grandchildren, Sofia and Carter.

Under Paul Warner's supervision, the Legislative Revenue Office prepared 108 formal research reports and an estimated 16,000 revenue impact statements. As the Oregon State Economist, he was the person responsible for making the revenue estimates upon which the surplus revenue "kicker" refund was based, a job some have characterized as the least enviable in all of state government. While Oregon tax policy has grown in complexity and volatility, he met all challenges with graciousness, evenhandedness, patience, and kindness.

When not pondering complex economic matters, Paul Warner loves learning about history and cheering on the Washington State University Cougars.
