WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Recognizes and honors Trooper Ralph Bates for his service to Oregon.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- The life and sacrifice of Trooper Bates

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Shortly after joining the Oregon State Police and celebrating his 24th birthday, Trooper Ralph D. Bates pulled over a motor vehicle on Highway 30 and took gunfire from the vehicle's driver. Despite being mortally wounded, he managed to record the license number of his assailant's vehicle, which led to successful apprehension of the shooter with no additional loss of life.

Oregon State Police Trooper Ralph D. Bates was born on September 26, 1938, in Long Beach, California, to Albert B. and Peggy M. Bates. He graduated from Medford High School in 1956 and bravely served his country in the United States Navy from 1956 to 1959. He was survived by his parents, two brothers, sister, and several nieces and nephews.
