

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 5703

By JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

2 Delete lines 5 through 30 and insert:

3 “**SECTION 1.** Section 3, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

4 “**Sec. 3.** The following amounts are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the
5 Administrative Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Business Development Depart-
6 ment, for the following purposes:

16 “**SECTION 2.** Section 4, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

17 “**Sec. 4.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Administrative
18 Services Economic Development Fund, to the Department of Education, for the State School Fund,
19 the amount of [*\$464,758,594*] **\$535,719,907**.

20 “**SECTION 3.** Section 6, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

21 “**Sec. 6.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Administrative
22 Services Economic Development Fund, to the office of the Governor, the amount of [*\$3,689,100*]
23 **\$3,723,949** for expenses of the Regional Solutions Program.

24 “**SECTION 4.** Section 7, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

25 “**Sec. 7.** (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall establish a process for al-
26 locating available moneys in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund on a quar-
27 terly basis to fulfill the biennial allocations made by sections 1 to [*12 of this 2017 Act*] **12a, chapter**
28 **598, Oregon Laws 2017**. The department shall set the quarterly allocations.

29 “(2) If, in any quarter, the moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative
30 Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by
31 sections 1 to [*12 of this 2017 Act or any other 2017 Act*] **12a, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017**, prior
32 to making any other allocations pursuant to sections 1 to [*12 of this 2017 Act*] **12a, chapter 598,**
33 **Oregon Laws 2017**, the department shall satisfy lottery bond debt service obligations in the amount
34 of [*\$247,787,311*] **\$246,357,867** for outstanding lottery bonds.

35 “(3) After the lottery bond debt service obligations described in subsection (2) of this section

1 are satisfied, if the remaining moneys transferred from the State Lottery Fund to the Administrative
2 Services Economic Development Fund are insufficient to pay for the quarterly allocations made by
3 sections 1 to [12 of this 2017 Act] 12a, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, the department shall reduce
4 the quarterly allocations not described in subsection (2) of this section proportionately in amounts
5 sufficient to accommodate the revenue shortfall.

6 “**SECTION 5.** Section 8, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

7 “**Sec. 8.** There is allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Administrative
8 Services Economic Development Fund, to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, the
9 amount of [~~\$247,787,311~~] **\$246,357,867** for the purpose of paying, when due, the principal, interest and
10 premium, if any, on outstanding lottery bonds, as described in section 7 [of this 2017 Act], **chapter**
11 **598, Oregon Laws 2017, as amended by section 4 of this 2018 Act.**

12 “**SECTION 6.** Section 10, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

13 “**Sec. 10.** Notwithstanding and in lieu of the requirement in ORS 461.549 (2) for a percentage-
14 based transfer of moneys, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, the amount allocated from the
15 Administrative Services Economic Development Fund to the Problem Gambling Treatment Fund is
16 [~~\$12,457,116~~] **\$12,498,909.**

17 “**SECTION 7.** Section 13, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

18 “**Sec. 13.** There are allocated for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Veterans’ Ser-
19 vices Fund, to the Veterans’ Department of Veterans’ Affairs Dedicated Lottery Fund, the following
20 amounts for the following purposes:

- 21 (1) [~~Veterans’ Services Program..... \$ 7,833,718~~]
22 **Veterans’ Services Program..... \$ 8,176,492**
- 23 (2) County Veterans’ Service
24 Officers \$ 6,904,151
- 25 (3) National Service
26 Organizations \$ 118,156

27 “**SECTION 8.** Section 17, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

28 “**Sec. 17.** There are allocated to the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training for the
29 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Criminal Fine Account, the following amounts for the
30 following purposes:

- 31 (1) Criminal justice training
32 [~~and standards operations..... \$ 32,584,757~~]
33 **and standards operations..... \$ 36,316,251**
- 34 (2) Public Safety Memorial Fund \$ 200,030

35 “**SECTION 9.** Section 20, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

36 “**Sec. 20.** There are allocated to the State Court Facilities and Security Account established
37 under ORS 1.178, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Criminal Fine Account, the fol-
38 lowing amounts for the following purposes:

- 39 (1) State court security

41 **and emergency preparedness.... \$ 3,615,658**
- 42 (2) Distributions to county court
43 facilities security accounts \$ 2,824,208

44 “**SECTION 10.** Section 23, chapter 598, Oregon Laws 2017, is amended to read:

45 “**Sec. 23.** (1) There is allocated to the State School Fund established under ORS 327.008, for the

1 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Oregon Marijuana Account, the amount of \$80,987,200.

2 “(2) There is allocated to the [*Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account established*
3 *under ORS 430.380*] **Oregon Health Authority**, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the
4 Oregon Marijuana Account, the amount of \$40,493,600, **for:**

5 “(a) **Deposit in the Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account established**
6 **under ORS 430.380; or**

7 “(b) **Purposes related to mental health treatment and alcohol and drug abuse prevention,**
8 **early intervention and treatment.**

9 “(3) There is allocated to the Oregon Health Authority, for the health systems division, for the
10 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Oregon Marijuana Account, the amount of \$10,123,400 for
11 purposes related to alcohol and drug abuse prevention, early intervention and treatment services.

12 “(4) There is allocated to the State Police Account established under ORS 181A.020, for the
13 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, from the Oregon Marijuana Account, the amount of \$30,370,200.

14 “**SECTION 11. This 2018 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
15 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2018 Act takes effect**
16 **on its passage.”**

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
