**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 1544**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “marijuana” delete the rest of
2 the line and line 3 and insert “; amending ORS 475B.928.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 through 5 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1.** ORS 475B.928 is amended to read:

5 “475B.928. (1) For purposes of this section, ‘reasonable regulations’ in-
6 cludes:

7 “(a) Reasonable limitations on the hours during which the marijuana
8 grow site of a person designated to produce marijuana by a registry iden-
9 tification cardholder, a marijuana processing site or a medical marijuana
10 dispensary may operate;

11 “(b) Reasonable conditions on the manner in which the marijuana grow
12 site of a person designated to produce marijuana by a registry identification
13 cardholder, a marijuana processing site or a medical marijuana dispensary
14 may transfer usable marijuana, medical cannabinoid products, cannabinoid
15 concentrates, cannabinoid extracts, immature marijuana plants and seeds;

16 “(c) Reasonable requirements related to the public’s access to the
17 marijuana grow site of a person designated to produce marijuana by a reg-
18 istry identification cardholder, a marijuana processing site or a medical
19 marijuana dispensary; and

20 “(d) Reasonable limitations on where the marijuana grow site of a person
21 designated to produce marijuana by a registry identification cardholder, a

1 marijuana processing site or a medical marijuana dispensary may be located.

2 “(2) Notwithstanding ORS 30.935, 215.253 (1) or 633.738, the governing
3 body of a city or county may adopt ordinances that impose reasonable regu-
4 lations on the operation of marijuana grow sites of persons designated to
5 produce marijuana by registry identification cardholders, marijuana pro-
6 cessing sites and medical marijuana dispensaries that are located in the area
7 subject to the jurisdiction of the city or county[.], **except that the gov-
8 erning body of a city or county may not adopt an ordinance that dif-
9 ferentiates between marijuana grow sites solely on the basis of
10 whether a marijuana grow site is subject to tracking under ORS
11 475B.895.”.**
