**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4029**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2 rest of the line and line 3 and insert “and prescribing an effective date.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 28 and delete page 2 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Recreation Along the Deschutes
5 Scenic Waterway is established.**

6 **“(2) The task force consists of 12 members appointed by the Gover-
7 nor as follows:**

8 **“(a) One member who is recommended to the Governor by the al-
9 ternative dispute resolution section of the Oregon State Bar with ex-
10 perience resolving natural resource issues;**

11 **“(b) One member with expertise in fish or riparian issues and who
12 represents an environmental organization;**

13 **“(c) One member with expertise in wildlife or terrestrial issues and
14 who represents an environmental organization;**

15 **“(d) One member representing outdoor recreation interests;**

16 **“(e) One member representing outdoor education interests;**

17 **“(f) One member representing neighborhood interests in Bend or
18 Sunriver;**

19 **“(g) One member recommended by the State Department of Fish
20 and Wildlife;**

21 **“(h) One member recommended by the State Parks and Recreation**

1 **Department;**
2 **“(i) One member recommended by the City of Bend;**
3 **“(j) One member recommended by Deschutes County;**
4 **“(k) One member recommended by the Bend Park and Recreation**
5 **District; and**
6 **“(L) One member appointed in consultation with the United States**
7 **Forest Service.**
8 **“(3) In making appointments to the task force, the Governor shall,**
9 **to the extent possible, appoint individuals who live or recreate in the**
10 **Bend or Sunriver areas.**
11 **“(4) The task force shall:**
12 **“(a) Develop options for a recreational trail alignment along or near**
13 **the Deschutes River from Sunriver through Bend, taking into consid-**
14 **eration the following:**
15 **“(A) The goal of achieving a net benefit to fish and wildlife;**
16 **“(B) The role of the local communities to manage recreational ac-**
17 **tivities along the river; and**
18 **“(C) The need to balance recreation, transportation and the con-**
19 **servation of fish and wildlife habitat;**
20 **“(b) Identify any state regulations that must be changed to accom-**
21 **plish the proposed trail alignment; and**
22 **“(c) Provide an evaluation of past, present and future conditions**
23 **affecting the Deschutes Scenic Waterway and identify anticipated ec-**
24 **ological impacts of the proposed trail alignment.**
25 **“(5) In making the recommendations under subsection (4) of this**
26 **section, the task force shall incorporate, to the extent possible, any**
27 **prior studies or planning on similar issues affecting scenic waterways**
28 **that have been conducted by state or local bodies.**
29 **“(6) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a**
30 **quorum for the transaction of business.**

1 **“(7) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**
2 **majority of the members of the task force.**

3 **“(8) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as**
4 **chairperson.**

5 **“(9) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority**
6 **shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.**

7 **“(10) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the**
8 **call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task**
9 **force.**

10 **“(11) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation**
11 **of the task force.**

12 **“(12) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided**
13 **in ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to**
14 **the appropriate joint legislative committee no later than September**
15 **15, 2019.**

16 **“(13) The State Parks and Recreation Department shall provide staff**
17 **support to the task force.**

18 **“(14) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation**
19 **or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task**
20 **force.**

21 **“(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,**
22 **are directed to assist the task force in the performance of duties of the**
23 **task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to**
24 **confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the**
25 **task force consider necessary to perform their duties.**

26 **“SECTION 2. A person, a public body as defined in ORS 174.109 or**
27 **a local service district as defined in ORS 174.116 may not construct a**
28 **bridge on the Deschutes River within that portion of the Deschutes**
29 **Scenic Waterway established under ORS 390.826 (5) beginning at the**
30 **Deschutes National Forest boundary in section 20, township 19 south,**

1 range 11 east, Willamette Meridian, and ending downstream at the
2 Central Oregon Irrigation District's diversion structure at river mile
3 171.

4 **"SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2018 Act is repealed on December 31,**
5 **2019.**

6 **"SECTION 4. Section 2 of this 2018 Act is repealed on January 2,**
7 **2021.**

8 **"SECTION 5. This 2018 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the**
9 **date on which the 2018 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative**
10 **Assembly adjourns sine die."**

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
