PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4127

- On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the semicolon delete the rest of the line and line 3 and insert "and prescribing an effective date.".
- Delete lines 5 through 28 and delete pages 2 through 5 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Qualifications-Based Selection is established.
- 6 "(2) The task force consists of seven members appointed as follows:
- 7 "(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from 8 among members of the Senate.
- 9 "(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two 10 members from among members of the House of Representatives.
 - "(c) The Governor shall appoint:

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- "(A) One member that represents state contracting agencies.
- 13 "(B) One member that represents local contracting agencies.
- "(C) One member that represents consultants that have provided architectural, engineering, photogrammetric mapping, transportation planning or land surveying services to contracting agencies in this state.
- "(3) The task force shall consider qualifications-based selection procedures set forth in ORS 279C.100 to 279C.125 and recommend in a report any changes to the procedures that the task force determines are necessary to accommodate the interests of state and local con-

- tracting agencies and the business needs of consultants that provide architectural, engineering, photogrammetric mapping, transportation planning and land surveying services to the contracting agencies.
- "(4) The task force may consult experts, take testimony, conduct research, prepare reports and other materials, investigate best practices in other states or jurisdictions and otherwise perform any other task that is necessary to carry out the purposes set forth in subsection (3) of this section.
- 9 "(5) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
 - "(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
 - "(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
 - "(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
- "(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.
- "(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
- "(11) The task force shall submit the report required by this section in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly related to public procurement no later than September 15, 2019.
- "(12) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall provide staff support to the task force.
- "(13) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

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"(14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task force's duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

"SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2018 Act is repealed on December 31,
2019.

"SECTION 3. This 2018 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2018 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.".

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
