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PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 4144

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 19 and delete <u>pages</u> 2 2 and 3 and insert:

"CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS

"SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2018 Act is added to and made a part
 of ORS chapter 701.

"SECTION 2. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 701.122 or 701.238, except as 8 provided in subsection (3) of this section, if an individual has the 9 equivalent of eight or more years of full-time work experience in the 10 construction, alteration, repair, addition to or improvement of resi-11 12 dential structures or small commercial structures and otherwise meets the qualifications for a license with a residential general contractor 13 or residential specialty contractor endorsement, the individual may 14 obtain a license as a contractor with a residential general contractor 15 or residential specialty contractor endorsement without: 16
