**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 4155**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after the first semicolon delete the
2 rest of the line and delete line 3 and insert “and declaring an emergency.”.

3 Delete lines 5 through 24 and delete pages 2 through 11 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Network Neutrality is estab-**
5 **lished.**

6 **“(2) The task force consists of 15 members appointed as follows:**

7 **“(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from**
8 **among the Senate.**

9 **“(b) The Senate Minority Leader shall appoint one member from**
10 **among the Senate.**

11 **“(c) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one**
12 **member from among the House.**

13 **“(d) The House Minority Leader shall appoint one member from**
14 **among the House.**

15 **“(e) The Governor shall appoint 11 members as follows:**

16 **“(A) Three representatives of broadband Internet access service**
17 **providers.**

18 **“(B) Three representatives of right-to-privacy advocates.**

19 **“(C) One representative nominated by the Public Utility Commis-**
20 **sion.**

21 **“(D) Two representatives of local governments.**

1 **“(E) One representative nominated by the State Chief Information**
2 **Officer.**

3 **“(F) One representative nominated by the Department of Justice.**

4 **“(3) The task force shall study and report on the issue of network**
5 **neutrality in the context of state contracts and shall:**

6 **“(a) Provide an analysis of the issues associated with network neu-**
7 **trality and state preemption.**

8 **“(b) Analyze issues that have arisen following the Federal Commu-**
9 **nications Commission’s Declaratory Ruling, Report and Order, and**
10 **Order, released on January 4, 2018.**

11 **“(c) Analyze the potential impact of legislation dealing with net-**
12 **work neutrality on the state government, with a focus on how it would**
13 **impact local governments and school districts.**

14 **“(d) Analyze the network management practices engaged in by**
15 **broadband Internet access service providers in this state.**

16 **“(e) Study the number of broadband Internet access service pro-**
17 **viders available in different areas of this state.**

18 **“(f) Study what would happen if there were no available broadband**
19 **Internet access service providers that would be willing to sign state**
20 **network neutrality certification documents.**

21 **“(g) Study how other states have implemented policies surrounding**
22 **network neutrality.**

23 **“(h) Study current state laws that could impact broadband Internet**
24 **access service providers that practice deceptive advertising by stating**
25 **they are complying with network neutrality provisions but are not.**

26 **“(4) The task force may develop proposed legislation on network**
27 **neutrality.**

28 **“(5) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes**
29 **a quorum for the transaction of business.**

30 **“(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a**

1 majority of the voting members of the task force.

2 “(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as
3 chairperson.

4 “(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
5 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

6 “(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the
7 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the
8 task force.

9 “(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation
10 of the task force.

11 “(11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided
12 by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to
13 the joint legislative committee relating to Information Management
14 and Technology no later than September 15, 2018.

15 “(12) The Department of Administrative Services shall provide staff
16 support to the task force.

17 “(13) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task
18 force are nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an ad-
19 visory capacity only.

20 “(14) Members of the task force who are not members of the Leg-
21 islative Assembly are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement
22 for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.

23 “(15) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111,
24 are directed to assist the task force in the performance of the task
25 force’s duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to
26 confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the
27 task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

28 “SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2018 Act is repealed on December 31,
29 2019.

30 “SECTION 3. This 2018 Act being necessary for the immediate

1 **preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is**
2 **declared to exist, and this 2018 Act takes effect on its passage.”.**

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
