




Homeownership Rates in the US and Oregon, 2000-2017

Note; Blacks and whites include only non-Hispanics.









Oregon Median Household Incomes by Race and Ethnicity, 2017


Homeownership Rates by Race Ethnicity





Homeownership Rates by Race Ethnicity





Homeownership Rates by Race Ethnicity



Problem Statement

Proposed Problem Statement

Oregonians do not have equal access to homeownership. In 2017, 65% of white households owned their homes compared to 63% of Asian households, 46% of Native American households, 43% of Latino households, 35% of African American households, and only 26% of Pacific Islander households. These disparities are the result of discriminatory housing policies that are exacerbated by present day barriers that disproportionately impact Oregon's communities of color.
